Sunday, September 29.—St. Michael the Archangel, the captain of the armies of God, the type of divine fortitude, the champion of every faithful soul in strife with the powers of evil. He led the heaven by hosts in the conflict which resulted in the opening of Lucifer. Ever since the coming of Christ he has been venerated by the Church as a special patron and protector.

Monday, September 30.—St. Jerome, Doctor, was born in Dalmatia, A. D. 329 and was sent to school at Rome. After distinguishing himself by his brilliancy in his studies he obeyed the call of God and became a monk. He is known as the author of the "Dialogues" which were written for four years in the desert of the mountains of the Apennines, and he was called to Rome by the Pope and given the task of revising the Latin Bible which was to constitute his noblest work.

Tuesday, October 1.—St. Remigius, sometimes known as Remi, was the son of noble and pious parents. He was appointed Archbishop of Rheims when he was only twenty-two years old. To him is accorded the distinction of having converted and baptized Clovis, King of the Franks, who at that time was warring the north of France from the Romans. The King was baptized on Christmas Day, A. D. 496, and his people followed the true Faith. Remigius also opposed the Arians in the South of France and when he died in 533, the nation was a Catholic kingdom.

Wednesday, October 2.—The Holy Guardian Angels. God has charged His angels with the ministry of watching and safeguarding every one of His creatures that behold not His face. Kingdoms have their angels assigned to them and men have their angels; these latter it is whom religion designates as the Holy Guardian Angels. The existence of the

Belgian Bishop And Two Priests Killed in China

Hankow, China, Sept. 27.—Bishop John Trudone Jans, O.P.M., of Sussex, Belgium, and two of his aides, Father Van Wert and Father Dynaert, have been slain by bandits near Siao Tung, Hupeh Province, it is reported.

The three missionaries were murdered by a band of Communist brigands in an isolated section of the province, according to a despatch from an Ichang correspondent received by the Belgian consulate here.

Bishop John Trudone Jans was appointed titular bishop of Rhodus, December 23, 1923, and was consecrated vicar apostolic of the Ichang vicariate May 1, 1924, at Chungking, China. He was born in Sison, Liege, Belgium, March 4, 1877, and entered the Franciscan Order in 1896. He was ordained September 8, 1903.

His jurisdiction in China comprised the major portion of the Hupeh Province, with headquarters at Ichang, where he made his residence. The Ichang vicariate, in 1928, had a population of 7,150,000 of whom 84,000 were Catholics.

That particular section of China has several missions, all of the Franciscan Order and most of them under Belgian priests.

Paris, Sept. 27.—Sunday, September 8th, on the feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin, a former captain in the air corps, M. Monnier, made his solemn profession at the Benedictine Abbey of Hautecombe in Savoy. Abbe Dom Lauré presided at the ceremony.

Anglican Clergyman And Four Of His Family Converted

London, Sept. 27.—An Anglican clergyman and four members of his family have recently entered the Church, separately and in different parts of the world, it is just revealed.

Mr. Maurice Frederick Bell, M.A., until last May, Anglican vicar of Newland, Worcestershire, has been received into the Catholic Church at the Abbey of St. Maurice, Canton Valais, Switzerland, by the Abbot.

A month earlier his wife had been received at St. George's Church, Worcester, England.

Their oldest son, Anthony Bell, had a flourishing preparatory school at Aldwick, near Bognor Regis, and he gave this up to become a Catholic.

The local priest, Father Kelly, O.S.B., received him. He has since been clothed as a novice at the Abbey of St. Maurice, where his father was received.

The second son, Roderick, who was working with an Anglican mission in India, found his way into the Church independently and has now returned to Europe to study for the priesthood with the Salesians at Fribourg, Switzerland.

The third son, Michael, was received a few days ago at the Abbey of St. Maurice. He is relinquishing a scholarship at St. Edward's School, Oxford, to go to Ampleforth, a Benedictine school.

Laymen's League Gets Good Start In Virginia

Washington, D. C., Sept. 27.—Many non-Catholics of Virginia have written to the officials of the Catholic Laymen's League of that State to express their approval of the organization's efforts to remove misconceptions of the Church's teaching and to promote good relations between her members and those of other religious groups.

An announcement of the objects of the Laymen's League, published in the daily newspapers of Richmond, brought commendatory letters from more than 100 non-Catholics in various sections of the State, including the rural districts. This indication of the response to the League's appeal for a hearing of the Church's case is contained in reports which the N.C.W.C. here has received from officials of the organization.

One of the letters praising the work for religious concord initiated by the Laymen's League, was written by a Baptist minister. One came from a former soldier, another from a prominent woman, and still another from a business man. In every case the writer deplored intolerance toward Catholics and voiced good wishes for the success of the League's endeavor.

The Catholic Laymen's League of Virginia was organized last Spring with the approval and assistance of the Rt. Rev. Andrew J. Brennan, Bishop of Richmond. One of its aims is the dissemination of apologetic literature among non-Catholics. Notwithstanding lack of adequate resources the League has distributed many hundreds of copies of "The Faith of Our Fathers" and large numbers of pamphlets explanatory of Catholic doctrine, devotions and practices.

World War Veterans Entering Priesthood Together in Chicago

Chicago, Sept. 27.—Two Chicago boys, both World War Veterans who saw service overseas, were ordained Saturday in St. James Pro Cathedral, Rockford, by the Rt. Rev. E. F. Hoban, D.D., Bishop of Rockford. Both are members of the Servite Order: Rev. Amadeus Calkins, O.S.M., and the Rev. Paul Moore, O.S.M.

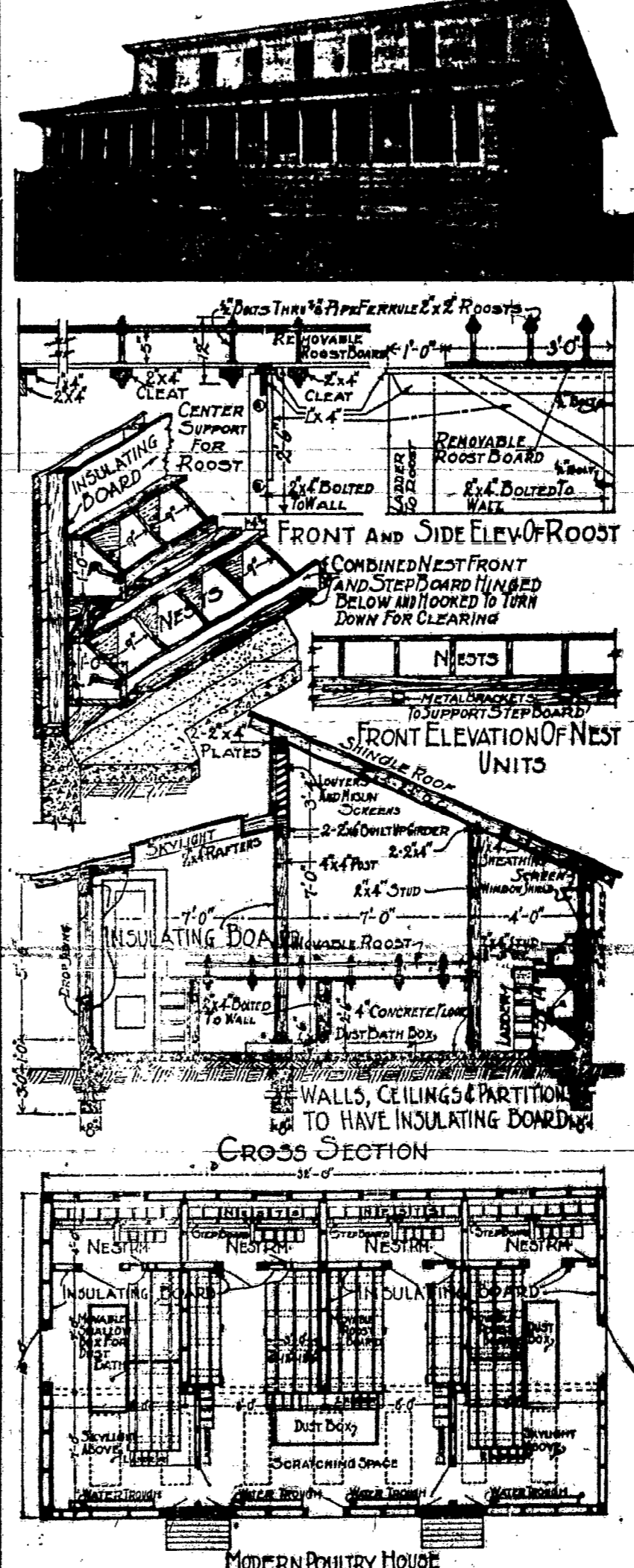
