DANSVILLE

1,600 People At Altar Rail At Forty Hours

Dansville, Oct. 4.—The Forty Hours devotion which opened in St. Mary's Church Friday, Sept. 29th, was brought to a most successful close on the following Sunday evening with a processional of the most Blessed Sacrament, Benediction and singing of the "Te Deum." Sixteen hundred people received Holy Communion by the Rev. Joseph Sofka, C. S. S. R. of Rochester and the pastor of St. Mary's Church, the Rev. Leo G. Hofschneider, during the three days were incentives to greater and more loving devotion to the Eucharistic King.

As they knelt in silence before His tabernacle home and tried to pierce beyond the sacramental veil and catch the sight of the dear Face of the Master Divine, the "Changelous Friend," all people realized that life would be too dark, too dreary and too lonely if Jesus were not with them in His tabernacle home, that the poignant griefs which lie too deep and cut the heart too keenly from the telling, the inexpressible racking pain of loneliness which beggars all description; the mothers' fears for "loved ones that she dare not, cannot put into words; fathers kneeling and speaking to Him of sharp struggles in the busy markets of the world, and of the hungry little faces that will all too surely greet him in the nearing future, unless the "Keeper of the little ones" quickly lends His aid. And as the tabernacle door closed Sunday evening following the raising of the Sacred Host in Benediction, the plea was:

"Stay with us, Lord! Day is far spent!
The evening draweth on;
What could Thy lonely children do
If Thou, their Light, were gone!
Twilight is round about us cast,
We hear the night wind moaning past,
Oh! till temptation's shadows flee,
Mane nobiscum, Domine!"

The Gloria and Creed are not said unless otherwise directed. The Preface is common unless another is directed. There is only one Collect unless others are directed.

October 6. The Twentieth Sunday after Pentecost. Mass is of the Feast, Gloria, Commemorate (in private Mass) Most St. Mark, second martyr of the same day. Preface of the Blessed Virgin.

October 7. Monday. Feast of St. Bridget. Mass of the feast. Gloria, St. Dionysius, etc. Mass of the feast. Gloria. Second collect of all the saints, third chosen by the priest. A Votive Mass is permitted.

October 10. Thursday. Feast of St. Francis Borgia. Mass of the feast. Gloria. Second collect of all the saints, third chosen by the priest. A Votive Mass is permitted.

October 11. Friday. No special feast. Mass is of the preceding Sunday. Second collect of all the Saints, third for the dead, fourth these improvements without incumbrance. The church has no debts. "Your joys are our joys, but your pain is your own." Bishop O'Hern declared after the presentation, and a hearty laugh greeted the statement.
