Solemn Service Celebrating Feast Of Christ the King

Dansville, Nov. 1. The feastday of the Kingship of Christ was solemnly observed at St. Mary's church last Sunday. In the beautiful liturgical ceremonies special attention was centered on the adoration of, reparation, and petition to the Eucharistic King. Xaverian Superior Leaves for Congo

Brussels, Nov. 1.—Crown Prince Humbert of Italy, whose engagement to Princess Marie Jose of Belgium was announced a few days ago, narrowly escaped death when a would-be assassin fired on him at a wreath laying ceremony at the tomb of the unknown soldier. Although several shots were fired, none took effect, and the Prince remained calm. The solemn ceremony was thrown into an uproar as the assassin, later caught and self-identified as Fernando di Rose, drew a pistol and fired wildly. He was overpowered by police, who saved him from the hands of the crowd only by dint of extraordinary efforts. The youth told police he was a member of a Communist group, and his attack on the Prince was "dictated by his conscience." He was lodged in jail.

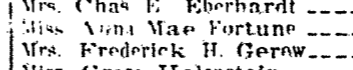
