Maroon and White basketball candidates are practicing zealously for their opening contest Thanksgiving week, and the fight has narrowed down to 15 determined candidates. These will be retained until the eve of the initial tilt, when either ineligibility or Coach Leary's selections will cut the squad to the final ten.
Danny Dowling, one of the outstanding point scorers in the State, is the only veteran on the Irish squad. Around him the usual powerful Aquinas offense will be moulded. "Bernie" Hynes, a substitute of last season's quint, appears to have garnered a regular guard berth. He is handicapped by his diminutiveness, but his exceptional shooting ability more than offsets this.
"Horse" Dennis and Jimmy Welch, reserve men of two years ago, are once more seeking varsity berths. Their size and experience may aid them greatly. Of the pair, Welch is the cooler player and a superior passer. Wilfred Burke and Randall Sargent, two rinky juniors, are waging a great battle for the open berth. McNally, a freshman, and a brother to "Yanno" McNally of Chicago tournament and St. Bonaventure College fame, has a fine opportunity to make the regulars. He is a yearling, but his size and ability rank him with upper classmen rivals.
The remainder of the squad seems to be of equal ability. Preference will be given to those who adapt themselves most readily to the Leary style of play. Mort has been staying sessions of touch football in the rear of the school to develop speed and endurance among his charges. Thus far it has been highly successful, for the squad is in mid-season form.
The reserves are also working out twice a week. About three-quarters of the squad are second-year men who exhibit a zealous spirit for the sport. That fervent spirit for the court game which thrived at the old Frank Street building seems to have been resurrected in the present Sophomore class. May it continue to thrive!
