Sister Hayes Celebrates Her 61st Year As Nun

Carmelite Sisters in Rochester Mother Beatrix of Philadelphia is waiting for permission to give us the first contemplative order of our Diocese. You know, their chief work is praying for priests. Those who are working outside the cloister may become discouraged. But when they come I want you to go there in spirit. There are 21, no more, living there in seclusion, with the Holy Sacrifice. They make this sacrifice for the needs of the Priesthood. They spend eight hours in the chapel, with five and a half hours for rest. There are no backs to their chairs; their beds are three or four planks, with a mattress a half an inch thick made of cornstalks. From the 14th of September to Easter Sunday, every day is a fast day for them. Some one told me that as many as 150 petitions a day reach them for prayers. Is it any wonder that with such an ideal we feel ourselves helped by the presence of such Religious? Yes we find contemplative orders, those who give their time to the highest spirituality. With their coming, we look for a new era for this Diocese.

"This afternoon, then, we unite with this Community and with the dear soul, and pray that God may spare her still to exercise her virtues of humility and charity, and joy to those who come to the convent. We thank the Religious for asking us to come, and we ask God's blessing on them."

human code, or a social club which may affect external conduct only. So we say that a religion which does not bind itself to what is certain and authoritative, does not bind to God Who is certainly its self and authority personified.

The Authority of Christ

"The Catholic Church claims that she knows the mind of Christ, that she preserves His teaching, and she asks her subjects to accept that teaching on Christ's authority, that is on the authority of God Himself. The Church is the mouthpiece and exponent of Christ's teaching. The Church does not ask Catholics to believe on her authority, but on the authority of Christ.

"This commission of Christ to His Church is found in Scripture: 'Teach all men to observe the things I have commanded you. He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved, but he that believeth not shall be condemned.' Mark 16:16. 'He that heareth you, heareth Me.' 'Whoever you shall bind on earth shall be bound in heaven.' 'As the Father hath sent Me, I also send you.'

"Christ, therefore, delegated the power of His own Mission to those who were to carry on that mission. So it is that we say that the Church of Christ is armed with divine authority, and all down those long centuries of teaching you will note the same confident tone of conscious authority. The authority which Christ conferred on His Church makes her truly the Light of the world."

truth. It throws responsibility upon the individual, and yet the self-verifying power of genuine truth is so great that these individuals find themselves drawn into comradeship with others, that as groups and churches they may share their experience of truth and search for it. This is my reply to the question concerning authority in religion.

"I agree with Father Mooney and my Catholic friends concerning the great importance and value of the church. I believe that vital religion will always be organized, not institutions, as the sex impulse is organized in marriage; the governing impulse in the state; the impulse of enquiry and curiosity in the school. But I cannot say that any one existing church is essential to the continuing life of the Christian religion or that any one church should include them all. The life of the tree is in the sap, but the sap cannot flow in a tree whose bark has been stripped off. So the life of religion is in the hearts of individuals. But religion will not work effectively there unless men unite and endeavor by mutual help to enlarge their faith and improve their practice. But just as there are many kinds of bark on the trees of the forest, so there are many kinds of religious groups adapted to various types of persons and one divine life flowing through them all.

"Concerning these different types of religion, I feel the truth of the illustration which Booker T. Washington used about the different races: 'We religious folk are separate as the fingers on many matters that divide us, but we may be united as one hand in upholding everything that is for the common good and as one fist in opposing the evils that threaten human welfare.'"
