after 42 years of missionary service, recalls the murder of her entire family by the anti-Christian fanatics in the Boxer Rebellion of 1900. Her faither, mother, sisters, brothers and as understood by the Catholic, is the relatives, to the number of 18, perished.

Sister Gabriel's vocation to the religious life to a community whose members she had never seen, sprang from the vivid accounts of the work of the Daughters of Charity by her grandfather who had visited Peking.
