Vatican City, Nov. 22.—The appointment of five new Cardinals by Pope Pius XI has just been announced in the Osservatore Romano. The appointments are to fill existing vacancies in the Sacred College. They are, as follows:

The Most Rev. Joseph MacRory, Archbishop of Armagh, Ireland, who succeeded the late Cardinal O'Donnell.

The Most Rev. Msgr. Emanuele Kardinal Gonsalves, Patriarch of Lisbon, Portugal, who succeeds the late Cardinal Mendes Beilye.

The Most Rev. Archbishop Verdier of Paris, who succeeds the late Cardinal Dubois.

The Most Rev. Archbishop Lavagna of Palermo, Italy, who succeeds the late Cardinal Laudi.

The Most Rev. Archbishop Minotelli of Genoa, Italy.

There are eight vacancies in the College of Cardinals, and it is expected that additional appointments may be made in the near future.

Jack Sharkey Among 25,000 at Priest's Grave

Malden, Mass., Nov. 29.—Jack Sharkey, champion for the heavy-weight championship of the world, was one of the pilgrims who visited the grave of the late Rev. Patrick J. Power last week. Sharkey, who is now in his fourth year, said that he had restored to her the right of her left eye, which has been defective since birth. The cemetery is closed now to all pilgrims, until further announcement.

Catholic Poet Made Member of Public Education Board

Boston, Nov. 29.—Arlington, one of the towns of Metropolitan Boston, has just chosen as a member of its school board the well-known Catholic poet and lecturer, Denis A. McCarthy, LL.D.

Besides being the author of half a dozen books of verse, Dr. McCarthy was for many years associate-editor of a Catholic paper in Boston, the now discontinued Sacred Heart Review. He is still a contributor of prose and verse to Catholic publications here and abroad. Many of his patriotic and religious poems have found their way into public and parochial school readers.

Dr. McCarthy has long been interested in school work. He lectures on educational subjects for the State Board of Education of Massachusetts.

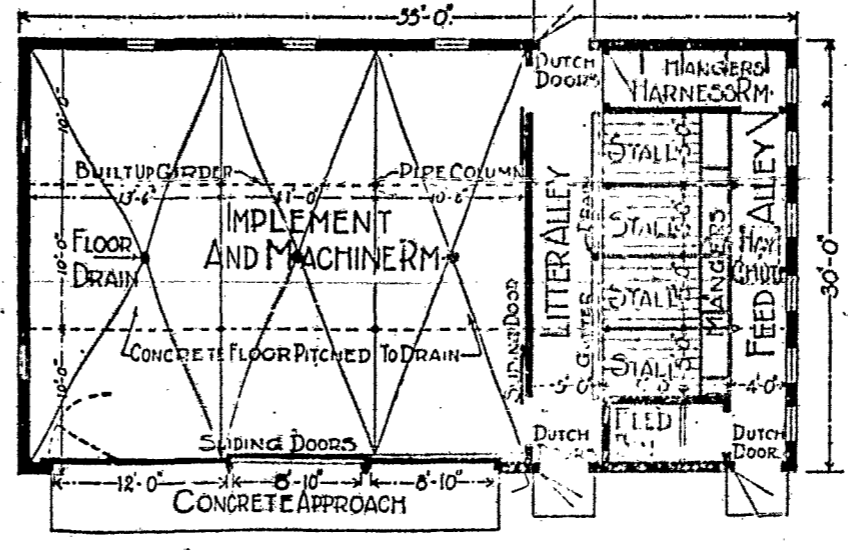

Combination Implement Shed and Horse Barn Profitable Investment

Modern farms have two sources of power—the tractor and horses. Tractors and the machinery and implements which they haul cost money and the investment in this equipment on most farms is considerable. However, a great many farmers desire to supplement their mechanical power with horses. Both have to be housed. In the accompanying illustration is shown a design for a combination horse barn and machinery shed with a second or now floor for the storage of roughage for the horses and for other live stock on the farm.

This is a most unusual farm building. However, the idea used by the

architect who designed this building will appeal to a great many farmers whose equipment is extensive and who also maintain a few head of horses. The details of the interior of the first

four horses and a harness room. A cross-sectional view of this barn will give those familiar with building, a good idea of how it is constructed and of the types and dimensions of the materials used. There also is a cross-section of one of the stalls.

There is an old saying that more farm machinery runs out than wears out. There is one good way to keep it from rusting out and that is to clean it thoroughly, grease the polished steel or iron parts, and put it away where it is safe from the weather when it is not in use. That is the idea of this building—to provide a safe weather-proof house for the machinery and also a place where it can be cleaned and cared for.
