St. Ann's Church, Newest Parish In Rochester

Parishioners Meet, Plan to Hold Fair and Make Other Plans for the Future New Church
 The members of the new parish dedicated to St. Ann held an enthusiastic meeting last Tuesday evening in preparation for the opening of the new church now under construction on Brighton Park, midway between the East and West Henrietta Roads. The meeting was attended by over 100 persons representing as many families. Many were not able to attend. The meeting was opened by Harry Bohrer, professor at Monroe Junior High School, after which Father Schmidt, assistant at St. Boniface, presided and reported to the parishioners all that had transpired up to that time giving an account especially of the financial position of the new church.
 It was decided during the meeting to hold a fair before the pews and altars are erected in the new church, for the benefit of the same. All the articles to be used for divine service in the church have been donated. The Misses Marguerite McCarthy and Luellie Bohrer were secretaries of the meeting and took the names of those present. These names will be placed in the corner-stone of the permanent church of the future.
 The church is being promoted by Bishop O'Hern to care for the spiritual needs of the Catholic families in the new University Section. Father Boppel, pastor of St. Boniface, is superintending the building construction, while Father Schmitt is organizing the parish.


