Early in October, 1893, the old asylum on Frank Street, where during half a century thousands of homeless children had been sheltered. was vacated, and the Sisters and children took up their abode in the new building on Clifton Street. Bishop McQuaid celebrated the first Mass in the chapel on October 14, but the formal opening of the asylum took place on Thanksgiving Day.
