Chairmen of the various committees, working under the general supervision of Thomas Riley, include George Wheelahan, Robert Fisher, George Hoek and Ray Sonntag.

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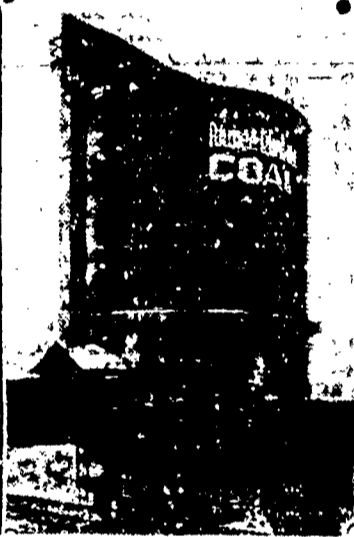
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Nazareth College
