**BISHOP WILL PONTIFICATE
TWICE AT THE CATHEDRAL
ON CHRISTMAS DAY**

The Rt. Rev. John Francis O'Hern, D.D., Bishop of Rochester, will celebrate two solemn pontifical masses in St. Patrick's Cathedral on Christmas Day, the first at midnight, and the second at 10:30 o'clock. He will speak at both Masses. The Rev. Charles F. Shay, rector of the Cathedral, will preach at the midnight Mass, and the service will be broadcast over WHAM.

Confessions will be heard at the Cathedral on Tuesday afternoon and evening, and the Masses on Christmas Day will be as follows: Midnight, solemn pontifical; 6 o'clock; 7:30; 8:30; 9:30, and a solemn pontifical Mass at 10:30. At the 10:30 Mass the sermon will be preached by the Rev. Benedict Ehmann. The students of St. Bernard's Seminary, under the direction of Prof. Petter, will join the Cathedral choir, directed by Prof. Eugene Bonn, in singing the Mass. There will be special musical programs for both solemn pontifical Masses.

**Church Receives
Generous Bequest,
And Pastor, Too**

Hornell, Dec. 20.—The will of Nellie L. Henry of Hornell, admitted to probate this week before Judge Mohrman in Steuben Surrogate's Court, names Frank E. Bronson as executor, and gives \$500 to the pastor of St. Ann's Church at Hornell; \$100 to Mary Pieniger of that city; the same amount to Mary Elizabeth Bronson. The residue is equally divided between St. James Mercy Hospital and St. Ann's Church, Hornell. The estate is \$8,000 realty and \$5,000 personally. The bequests to St. Ann's Church and to St. James Mercy Hospital will be substantial ones, and will be greatly appreciated by the church and hospital.

the closing rules printed below. The judges will be on hand on Saturday night at 10 o'clock and seal the strong box, which is now in position in the Subscription Club offices, 50 Reynolds Arcade, and in which the members may deposit their subscriptions without letting anyone know just how many they are adding to their total.

The best advice that can be given to any member who hopes to win is "to work during the remaining hours as you never worked before." It is a close race, so close in fact that less than the votes allowed on a two-year

subscription may separate the winners of the grand prizes.

The Prizes

The member who succeeds in rolling up the highest score of votes will be given \$2,000 in cash as the first grand award. Second highest member will win the \$1,645 Marmon 8 Sedan, second grand award. Third highest will receive the \$1,180 Dodge 6 Sedan, third grand award. Fourth highest member will win the \$945 Oldsmobile Sedan, fourth grand award. Fifth highest member will receive the \$675 Chevrolet Coach and sixth highest will be given \$200 in cash, the sixth grand award.



3. All subscriptions must be placed in the strong box or turned in to the office by 10 o'clock, Saturday night, December 21, or mailed and postmarked before that time.

4. Members mailing their subscriptions should place a special delivery stamp on the envelope, to insure subscriptions reaching the Catholic Courier and Journal promptly. The postmark will be taken as evidence that the subscriptions were mailed before the closing hour. However, all subscriptions to apply in the Catholic Courier and Journal Subscription Campaign must reach the Catholic Courier and Journal before the audit is completed, irrespective of the postmark.

5. Members depositing subscriptions in the sealed strong box should be careful to see that the subscriptions and money to cover them tally. Members depositing subscriptions in the strong box will receive the regular itemized receipt after the close of the drive.

6. The doors of the Catholic Courier and Journal Subscription Campaign will be closed after 10 o'clock, Saturday night, December 21. Members who wish to deposit their business in the strong box, should be sure to reach the offices before that time. Members arriving at club headquarters before 10 o'clock will be waited upon.

7. After those entitled to be waited upon have placed their subscriptions in the strong box, the judges will apply the final seal to the small opening in the top of the box and declare the drive closed.

8. There can be no announcement as to the identity of the winners until certified public accountants have carefully audited and verified all subscriptions and votes and arranged the names of all winners for publication. The audit will be completed as quickly as possible in order to permit the Catholic Courier and Journal to announce the winners of all awards at an early date.
