40th Anniversary Of Holy Rosary Church Jan. 19th

The 40th anniversary of the celebration of the first Mass in Holy Rosary Church will be celebrated on Sunday, January 19th, according to an announcement just made by the rector of the church, the Rev. Arthur A. Hughes. The Rt. Rev. John Francis O'Hern, D.D., Bishop of Rochester, will celebrate a solemn pontifical Mass on that date, and there will be a sermon in keeping with the occasion.

The anniversary proper fell on January 1st, but as it was impossible for Bishop O'Hern to be present on that day the celebration was put over until the 19th. The Holy Rosary parish was established in 1889 by the late Bishop McQuaid, and the first church was completed and dedicated on January 1, 1890, by Bishop McQuaid. The Rev. James P. Kiernan, V.G., celebrated the Mass on that day. Priests from the Cathedral served the new church for a time. In 1895 the Rev. John G. VanNess was appointed first pastor of the parish. A school was erected at the time the church was completed, and was placed in charge of the Sisters of St. Joseph. These good Sisters are still in charge of the parish school, and they have accomplished great good in the parish. Father VanNess died in January, 1909, and the Rev. James H. Day was appointed pastor of the parish. He erected a convent for the Sisters of St. Joseph in 1912. Two years later, on January 31, 1914, he died

London, Jan. 3.—A movement among the churches has been started by The Morning Post here aimed at the framing of a national protest against the resumption of official relations with the Russian Soviet government, on the ground that that government has declared war on the Christian religion.
