

Nuns Work in Factories In Holland to Safeguard Girl Employees' Morals

The Hague, Jan. 24.—The Ladies of Nazareth, the religious community to whom the Bishop of Harlem, Holland, has entrusted the direction of the social service work carried on in his diocese among women, have chosen what appears to be the safest and surest method to become acquainted with the inner life of factory and shop girls and to assist them spiritually and morally. They share their tasks in factory, mill and shop, go every day to and fro to their work with them, stand at the same machines and sit at the same working tables.

The novel work was first tried two years ago, when one of the ladies of Nazareth hired herself to do up checklets and chocolate bars in a candy factory of The Hague.

Girls' Health Endangered.—"Permission to work over time (eight hours) is too readily granted by the State officials in plants employing female personnel. The girls' health is thereby endangered and all earnest personal initiative is

frustrated in the end by numerous factories nothing is done to safeguard public morality. Girls working in these plants are those who are frequently taken up to the advance of their position and authority.

Supernatural Maternity.—"The second reason is the natural maternity, whereby the Church, by the example of the Christ, generates, nourishes and educates souls in that Divine life of grace with its sacraments and its teachings. There is, with good reason, St. Augustine's opinion: 'He shall not have God for father who refused the Church for mother.'

clusively on her and which, therefore, are absolutely superior to other reasons of a natural order.

The first reason is the explicit mission to teach entrusted to the Church by its Divine founder. All power is given to me in Heaven and in earth. Going, therefore, teach ye all nations; baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost, teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you; and behold I am with you all days, even to the consummation of the world.

"At the same time as a mandate to teach, Christ conferred infallibility in educational work on His Church. Wherefore, 'the Church was constituted by His Divine authority as the column and foundation of truth in order that it may teach men Divine faith and may direct and inform men of their actions toward honesty of customs and integrity of life according to revealed doctrine.'
