Army-Notre Dame Game Played In Chicago in Nov.

Rochester boosters for Notre Dame's famous football team will have to go to Chicago, this Fall if they want to see the Army-Notre Dame annual game. For this week it was decided to transfer the game from the Yankee Stadium in New York City to Soldier's Field, Chicago. Announcement of the transfer of the game was made on Tuesday, after a conference between the Rev. Charles J. O'Donnell, C.S.C., President of Notre Dame University, and Major Philip Fleming, graduate manager of athletics at West Point.

Reasons for Transfer The Army-Notre Dame game was set for the Stadium on Nov. 29, and Notre Dame was scheduled to play Southern California at Los Angeles on Dec. 6. This schedule would necessitate the players leaving Southern California on Nov. 25, leaving New York on Sunday, Nov. 30; rushing to Los Angeles and then not being able to return to South Bend before Dec. 9 or 10. This, it was pointed out, meant keeping the players from their classes for more than two weeks.

History of Series The Army-Notre Dame series began in 1913 and has been interrupted only once in the war years. It was inaugurated at the Plains of West Point and was continued there up to and including 1922. In the following year the game was switched to Ebbetts Field, Brooklyn. In 1924 it was played for the first time at the Yankee Stadium and has been played every year thereafter at that place. Sixteen games have been played in the series. Notre Dame has won eleven, Army four, and one has been tied.

Japanese Admiral A Leading Catholic Figure In the Orient

(By N. C. W. C. News Service) Tokyo, Japan, Feb. 14. Admiral Yamamoto is undoubtedly one of the foremost figures in the Catholic Church of the Orient today. He was once a pupil of the Brothers of Mary in Japan, and became a convert while under their direction. He applied for admission to the Society, but Very Rev. Father Heinrich, the provincial, thought that the distinguished convert would be able to do more for the Faith by remaining in the world. The Admiral married, and has two sons, who have already obtained his consent to become Brothers of Mary. While Admiral Yamamoto was in the navy, he never failed to practice his religion, though this was by no means easy in the midst of his pagan fellow-officers. On one occasion, during the Russo-Japanese War, the Admiral came ashore, went to a community of the Brothers of Mary, and asked to see the chaplain. Upon the appearance of the priest, the Admiral asked for Holy Communion. It was then twice in the afternoon and he was still fasting.

(Continued from Page One) ever to be admitted to serve the altar, whose sons did not by their lives and conduct give proof of a virtuous education. How deeply in contrast is not this solitude of the great apostle for the souls of the liturgical ones, with those parents who think more of their worldly progress and their worldly success. This simple reflection, we are told, drew tears from Crates, heathen philosopher, who, mounting himself on the highest place in the City of Athens, cried out with all his strength: Citizens, what is it you think of? You employ all your time in heaping up riches to leave your children; yet take no care to cultivate their souls with virtue, as if an estate were more precious than themselves.

An Important Need "And so today in this Western world, after all these centuries of church dedications, we are dedicating another church to the honor and glory of God and to the good St. Ann as its patroness. This church will fill a very important need in this section of our rapidly growing city, for it is built on a site which is surrounded, as it were, with natural barriers or walls. The Genesee River to the West, the county buildings to the East, the Canal to the South, and the cemetery and Highland Park to the North, furnish the frame, we might say, of the picture which is now fairly well developed in this particular suburban section of our city. Commons Fights Bill To Amend Blasphemy Laws

(By N. C. W. C. News Service) London, Feb. 11. A private bill to amend the blasphemy laws was read a second time in the House of Commons where, in debate, it met considerable opposition due, apparently, to a lack of confidence in the forces which appear to be arrayed behind it. Mr. Thurtle, a socialist member, sponsored the proposal which is that "No criminal proceedings shall be instituted in any court against any person for schism, heresy, blasphemy, blasphemous libel or obscenity."
