\$2,539,783 Will Be Paid Owners Of Irish Bonds

New York, March 21.—Supreme Court Justice Curtis A. Peters, announced that he has approved the distribution of \$2,539,783 among 129,031 holders of bonds of the former Irish Republic.

The subscribers will receive approximately 58 cents for each dollar of their original investment. It is estimated that the distribution will require two months at the rate of 3,000 checks every working day.
