

Jewish City Councilors All Resign in Jerusalem In Protest of Favoritism

Jerusalem, April 4.—All four of the Jewish City Councilors of Jerusalem have resigned. They declare that their efforts for the past three years to improve Jewish interests in Jerusalem municipal affairs had been unavailing.

That Communist influences are concerned with attempts to stir up racial feeling is indicated by the fact that police at Gaza have arrested a Palestinian Communist leader for whom a long search had been made.

At the same time the Council of Jerusalem Jews, representing the communal interests of the race, telegraphed the Colonial Office in London protesting against Ragheb Bey Nashashibi, the Mayor of Jerusalem, having joined the Arab political delegation that has gone to negotiate with the British Government for Palestine's independence.

Weapons Are Forbidden An order forbidding people to congregate in the streets, carry weapons of any description, sing inflammatory songs or otherwise incite disturbances was issued today by the government for the coming month.

Priest Ordained Here Last June Dies of Injuries

Blanchington, April 4.—The Rev. Father Patrick Kelly, of Blanchington, who was ordained to the priesthood at St. Patrick's Cathedral, Rochester, on June 8, 1929, by the Rt. Rev. John Joseph O'Brien, D.D., Bishop of Rochester, died here on Monday this week of injuries sustained when his automobile overturned on Tuesday evening last week.

Mr. Kelly had just returned from a trip to St. James' Church, Johnson City, just prior to the accident. He was driving to Syracuse with the Rev. J. T. Leonard of Blanchington and Rev. Joseph M. Young of Johnson City.

Mr. Kelly was born in Syracuse, a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. Daniel J. Kelly of that city. He made his home in recent years with an aunt, Mrs. Jeremiah Kelly, 219 Burnett Avenue, Syracuse. He graduated from the Christian Brothers' Academy in Syracuse, made his college course in Niagara University and his seminary course in St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester.

The Love Story of Mass, To Be Shown Here April 10, Heartily Approved by Bishop

Reverend Benedict Edmund, who has been heard on the organ over the radio in the local Catholic church every Sunday from St. Patrick's Cathedral, this city will play the instrumental music which accompanies the presentation of the pictures of "The Sacred Love Story of the Mass" next Thursday evening, April 10th, in the Columbus Auditorium, at 8:30 P. M.

The picture play with accompanying music of the Mass, will be given in the pictures during the World War and night Masses in the Cathedral of Cologne, with the exterior of the Cathedral lit up in the snow.
