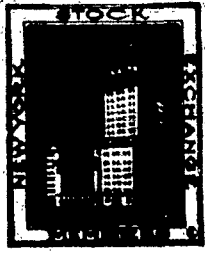

**Colored Easter Eggs**  
 At one time, it is claimed, the use of eggs as food was forbidden during Lent. **Discover Hidden Mosaic On Wall Of Holy Sepulchre**

Jerusalem, April 11.—Two events have just taken place within the Basilica of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem, which will without doubt please pilgrims the Catholic world over. The first concerns the discovery, made some days ago, of a splendid mosaic on the vault of Calvary representing Our Lord Jesus Christ. This find is in the south nave of the sanctuary. The mosaic had been heretofore invisible because it was entirely covered by stucco.

The second event concerns the Church of St. Helena. This monument goes back to the Crusades. This subterranean chapel succeeded, though in smaller proportions, the great Basilica of Constantine and Patriarch Modestus. The Grotto itself of the Finding of the Holy Cross is situated at the end of the aisle on the right and belongs to the Latins. A flight of 13 steps, cut in the rock and considerably worn by the feet of many generations of pilgrims, leads down to this Grotto. In 1898 the Franciscan Fathers prepared an iron staircase to support the ancient stone steps. But the Orthodox always opposed it though the Latins were the proprietors of this sanctuary. Despite this opposition the Franciscans put the iron staircase on the occasion of the feast of the Invention of the Holy Cross in May, 1916. But an order by the Turkish Government caused it to be taken away within 24 hours. Now through the good offices of the British High Commissioner in Jerusalem, the iron staircase has been replaced.
