Painting by Edward J. Fischer

History of Parish

The Mt. Carmel parish was organized in 1904 by the first Bishop of Rochester, the Rt. Rev. Bernard McQuaid, D.D., and the first church was built and dedicated in 1909. The Rev. Dr. Orestes Canali was appointed pastor of the parish in 1906, and the first church was dedicated by Bishop Thomas F. Hickey, second Bishop of Viminianum. The Rev. John Raboin was pastor of the church for some time, and the present pastor, Rev. Walter A. Foery, has been at the head of the parish for a number of years.

Father Foery is one of the most zealous and likeable pastors in the Diocese. He has accomplished marvelous results in the Mt. Carmel parish, and by his fidelity to duty, his kindness, his priestly zeal and his interest in all things that concern his people he has won the sincere love and respect of all his parishioners, as well as of many people outside of his parish. He will have the congratulations and good wishes of many, many people on the completion of his new church. There will be many, too, who recognizing the sacrifices made by the people of the Mt. Carmel parish to obtain their new church, will be glad to give material assistance in the past or in the future.

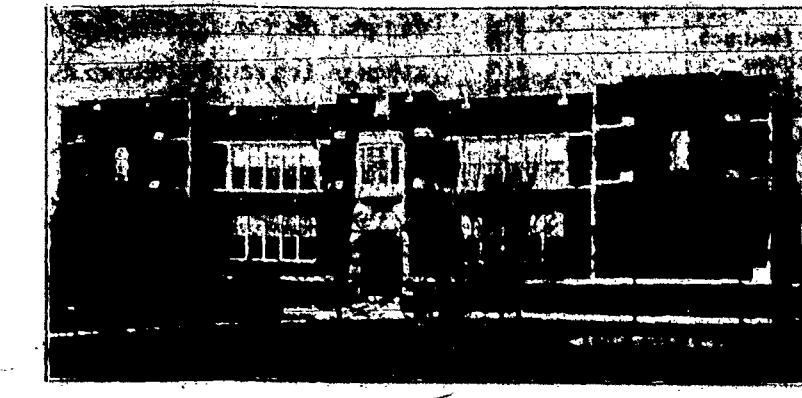

New Parochial School Dedicated by Bishop O'Hern Sunday in City of Elmira

Elmira, May 16. The Rt. Rev. John Francis O'Hern, D.D., Bishop of Rochester, dedicated the new St. Casimir Parochial School here Sunday afternoon, in the presence of a large number of people. At the dedication service, and also at a solemn high mass in St. Casimir's Church in the morning, Bishop O'Hern paid fine tribute to the Polish people and to their patron, St. Casimir. The day was one of great joy in St. Casimir's parish.

The dedication ceremonies were opened with pontifical benediction by Bishop O'Hern in the church. After this service, the clergy and congregation marched in procession to the school building.

A beautiful new American flag and flagpole, donated to the school by a friend, were blessed first. The band played "The Star Spangled Banner" and the audience stood with uncovered heads.

The rooms and corridors of the school were then blessed, and a large entrance to the building. Bishop O'Hern dedicated the school "to the service of God and American ideals." The congregation then entered the fine, big auditorium in the school, where Bishop O'Hern delivered the dedicatory address. He spoke in part as follows:

Story of Faith and Generosity

"The parochial school is nothing new in the Catholic Church as it goes back to the very first ages of Christianity when the cathedral schools were established close to the episcopal residence in which the youth were educated and trained, particularly for the priesthood.

"Among all the accomplishments of the Polish people in their own native land and in this adopted country, the growth in numbers and efficiency of the Polish parochial schools, speaks a story of faith, patriotism, unparaltered generosity, and also supreme effort on the part of the clergy, the religious sisterhoods and the laity who came to this country with no asset but their willing hands and the faith of their fathers. The Polish people are always keen and anxious to have their own parochial school in which their heritage is taught to their children. This is such an outstanding fact in their history that they are, without doubt, unique among all the nation's allies.
