

Superior St. Basil Order, Missing Since November, Is Found Drowned in River

The body of Rev. Francis Forster, C.S.B., superior-general of the Order of St. Basil, who disappeared on the Montreal docks on Nov. 11, last, was found a few days ago in the St. Lawrence River. Father Forster went to Montreal from Toronto on a clerical trip. When waiting for his arrival he walked out on the dock in the night. He was over-sightful, and it is believed he accidentally stepped on the dock in the water, or slipped on some one and went into the water.

Vatican City, May 16.—The Congregation of Rites has announced that eight Jesuit martyrs of North America will be canonized on June 29th, at the same time as the illustrious Jesuit Cardinal Belfragin and the blessed Theophilus da Corte.

The eight Jesuits were put to death by Indians, and the story of their heroism is one of the most stirring in missionary annals. They are as follows:
