If we could draw the curtain of time to-day we would see that sainted woman, sweet faced, smiling down from the azure sky to day up on her boy Tom.

Notre Dame Gets Large Bequest In Lawyer's Will

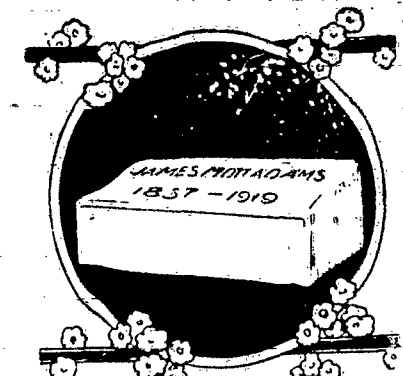
