Whey Sherbet .- Take one quart of whey, the juice of one lemon, one tablespoonful of gelatin disserved in one fourth of a cupful of fold water, one and one-fourth cupfuls of sugar, one cupful of crushed pinesciple or cherries, berries or orange juice. Mix and freeze as usual, adding the fruit when the mixture is partly frozen. When used in bread-making, instead

of water or milk, scald it always to insure the bread from souring.

Whey should be scalded if kept for a day or two, then it may be served In any way desired.

two tablespoonfuls of melted butter, one-eighth teaspoonful of turmeric, three tablespoonfuls of flour, onefourth cupful of sugar, and a dash of carenne. Heat the whey, add the dry ingredients well mixed, then add the butter and cook until smooth. A bit of mustard may be added if desired and one egg substituted for the


