Cleveland, O., June 13.—The Rt. Rev. Joseph Schrembs, D.D., Bishop of Cleveland, has just purchased for the Diocese the historic Episcopal Church of St. Paul, at the corner of Euclid Avenue and Fortieth Street, and will convert it into a Shrine for the perpetual adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.

Beautiful New Shrine To Be Built at Auriesville, On Site of Jesuit Martyrs

ARTESVILLE, N. Y., June 13.—Here where Rev. Francesco Giuseppe Bossani, S. J., was tortured for two awful months, where the beloved Teakewita, the "Lily of the Mohawks," faced death because of her fidelity to the Faith, where Rev. Isaac Jones, Rev. Gouillard and Rev. de Lalonde, all members of the Society of Jesus, suffered martyrdom nearly 200 years ago here, on the ground hallowed by their blood, a beautiful new shrine is to be erected to perpetuate their memory and their heroic love for the Catholic religion.

Thousands of pilgrims come here every year to hear Holy Mass, to pray and to receive Communion on the site where these martyrs suffered and died for the Faith. The canonization of the martyrs has aroused such nation-wide interest in the Shrine that the erection of a Shrine building has become an imperative necessity.
