## 50,000 Attend Beatification of Nun in St. Peter's

Vatican City, June 13.—Pope Pius XI, surrounded by his blue-clad noble guard and the Cardinals of the Curia in purple and fine lace, descended from the Vatican palace into St. Peter's Sunday afternoon to do homage to the memory of blessed Paola Frassinetti, beatified in imposing ceremonies.

This was the first of the cycle of beatifications and canonizations to occur this month, which is the last of the prolonged jubilee year set apart to celebrate the Pope's half century in the priesthood. The fact that it fell on the feast of Pentecost, of Whitsunday, added to the solemnity of the rites. The great congregation of more than 50,000 in St. Peter's besides hearing the thanksgiving service for the beatification, was also privileged to hear Pontifical vespers as only the Sistine Choir can render it.

The Pope proceeded to the altar beneath which lie the remains of St. Peter and upon which were laid today the relics of the beatified nun, Paola Frassinetti. Above the altar hung her portrait, unveiled only that morning. The Pontiff remained for several moments kneeling in silent prayer. Then he took his place on the throne prepared for him and presided over the ceremony of the beatification of the blessed sacrament. At the conclusion he imparted the apostolic blessing, and thereafter some relics of blessed Paola, together with a copy of her biography and a mass of fresh flowers, symbolic of the purity of her life, were presented to him.

St. Peter's will witness another beatification next Sunday when the venerable Conrad von Parham, Capuchin lay brother of the diocese of Passau, will have the homage of both Pope and faithful laity. A number of imposing pilgrimages from Germany are expected, the largest being from Bavaria, where the venerable Conrad's life and works left a lasting impression.

who is the Alpha and Omega of all things. For religion is the perennial fount of hope, and it is hope that sustains man amid all his struggles, ever impelling him to deeds of virtue and of valor.

Conscience Is Vital

"In order that our government may persevere, there must be law and order, and from the knowledge of the law immediately springs conscience. And what is it we need today in America if not a more lively and tender conscience, public and private, in the interpretation of the law in particular cases? Again, conscience springs from and is founded in religion, and religion is the heart of all morality.

"Hence it is that we feel that by your coming here today to honor one hundred years of religious faith and Christian morality as exemplified in the lives of those pioneers who laid the foundations in the 'Church of the Woods,' the first country Catholic church in all the State of New York, you are teaching by word and example a tremendous lesson in government and in the solution of the problem of crime. And of how urgent is not this solution and how vital to our beloved country when we know that at this very hour, while we are the greatest nation in the world in material, comfort and progress, at the same time we are also the most lawless of them all.
