A public letter against recent anti-Christian tendencies in education written by the Chinese secular priest with the imprimatur of His Lordship Bishop Tsu, Vicar Apostolic of Haimon, has met with no denial by the Government.

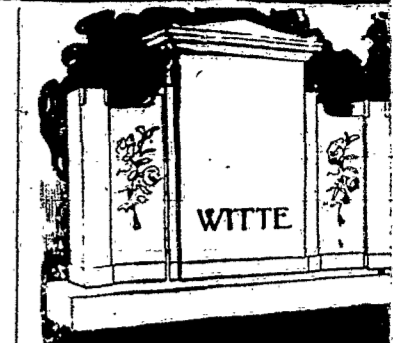
