

Two New Saints Are Canonized By Pope Pius in St. Peter's, Sunday, Caterina Thoma, Lulucia Filippini

Vatican City, June 27.—Two new saints were canonized in St. Peter's last Sunday, in a ceremony that was beautiful and impressive.

There was a vast congregation of more than 50,000 people present at the ceremony, and among them were descendants of the families of both saints.

Pope Pius, in a Latin allocution, solemnly proclaimed the canonization of Caterina Thoma, a Spanish canoness, and Lulucia Filippini, Italian foundress of a teaching order of nuns.

The Rev. Thomas J. Walsh, D. D., bishop of Newark, N. J., who has a large colony of Filippini Sisters teaching in his diocese, participated in the solemn religious procession before the canonization.

Pope Pius set the feast day for Saint Caterina Thoma to be April 12 and for Saint Lulucia Filippini, March 25.

Despite the heat of the day and the weight of his ecclesiastical vestments, the Pontiff appeared very vigorous. His voice, whether chanting or speaking, rang out resonantly through St. Peter's.

Birth Control View Of Miss Fox Her Own, Says Red Cross Aide

Washington, June 26.—John Barton Payne, head of the Red Cross, has sent to Mr. John D. Ryan of New York City an answer to a letter which he received from Mr. Ryan complaining of the action of Miss Elizabeth G. Fox, Director of the Public Health Nursing Service of the American Red Cross Society, in addressing a group in favor of "legalizing the distribution of birth control information."

"I am glad to have yours of the 7th, enclosing a clipping from 'America,' read a statement by Miss Elizabeth G. Fox, published in the 'New York Times,' re birth control. I had not heard of the matter until I received your letter."

"The American Red Cross cannot be bound by the statement of an individual who happens to entertain this of that view. It can only be bound by the action of the Central Committee, or in its absence a statement by an official authorized to speak. Miss Fox does not come within this category. The American Red Cross never takes any part in controversial questions, either of political, religious or social character. The subject of birth control does not fall within its purview."

"Since the receipt of your letter Miss Fox has been asked the specific questions as to the circumstances under which she made the statement. She declines definitely speaking for the Red Cross and states she was giving expression entirely to her own individual views."

Dublin, June 27.—The recent Irish Free State census shows that the proportion of unmarried people in the Irish Free State is greater at all ages than that of any other country.

The next highest known percentage of males unmarried at 25-30 years is that of Sweden, 54.5 per cent, the corresponding figure for Ireland being 47.5 per cent.

In England and Wales the percentage of females unmarried between 25 and 35 years of age is 41.5 per cent, and in the United States 35 per cent.

An analysis of the Irish return indicates that one out of every four women who remain in the Free State never marry, but 4.3 per cent of women there have far more children than do the married women of other countries.

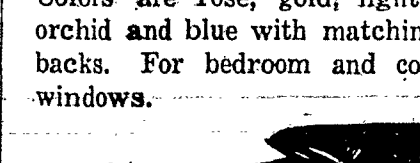

Two London Papers Will Publish Purified Editions for Ireland, Eliminating Much of Crime News

Dublin, June 27.—Two English newspapers, "The People" and "The Empire News" were barred a short time ago from circulation in Ireland because they published an excessive quota of "crime" news.

Meanwhile, two more books have been banned from the Free State under the Censorship Act. They are the "Intimate Journals of Paul Gauguin," and an anonymous German war book, "Seltsam," both published in London.

The Irish censorship law, under which six newspapers and 15 books have been barred since it went into effect early in May, provides that the Minister of Public Justice, who is at present Fitzgerald Kennedy, may bar periodicals for a period of three months.

Newspaper proprietors have no right of defense against editors, publishers and authors may make representations to the authorities. Mr. Kennedy is guided by a board of censors under the chairmanship of the Rev. Canon Bohand of Maynooth College, a well-known Catholic institution.

The birth control books of Margaret Sanger have been banned from Ireland, and a number of books covered by the same order.
