The Pope's niece and her husband, the Marquis and Marchioness Persected Ugollat, were present as Cal of Gospel beneficiaries of miracles believed to have been wrought by the interces sion of Saint Lulucia Filippini.

Pope Plus, in a Latin allocation, solemnly proclaimed the canoniza-tion of Caterina Thoma, a Spanish canoness, and Lulucia Filippini, Italian foundress of a teaching order


