Paderewski Will Give 75 Concerts In This Country

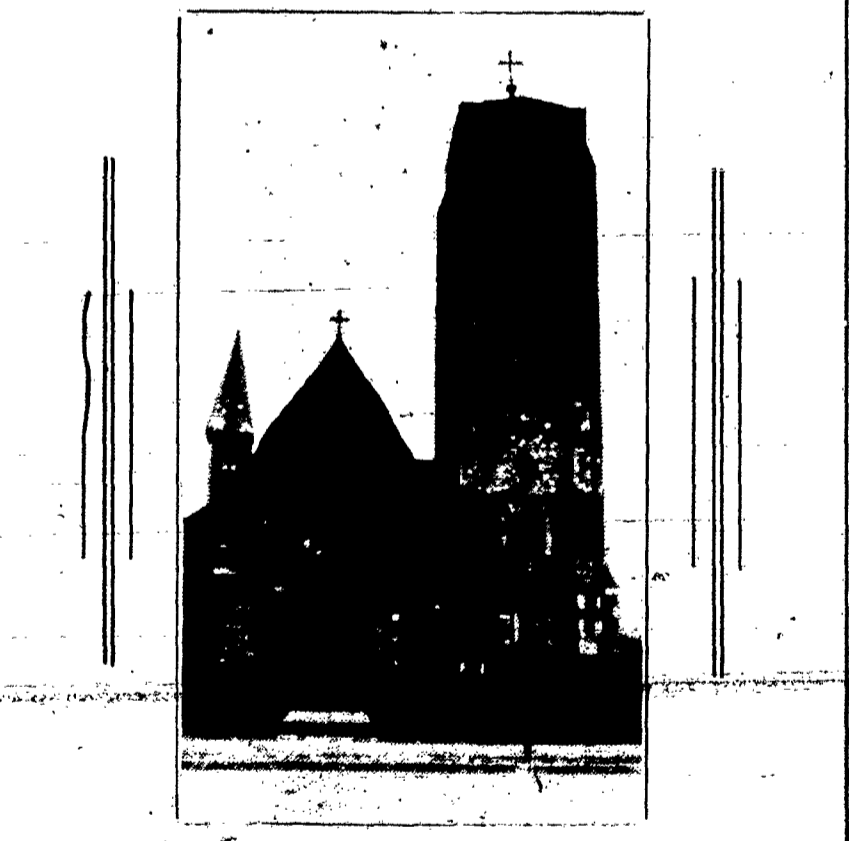
WARSAW—America is to see soon fall in the person of Ignace Paderewski, one of the greatest pianists Poland has ever had, and the greatest pianist of modern times. He is fully recovered from the illness that forced him to cancel his American tour last fall. He is booked for 75 engagements in the United States. Paderewski's career is unique. For years before the World War the great pianist was recognized as one of the most accomplished musicians ever to grace a concert stage. When the war started he cast aside his beloved piano and went wholeheartedly into the trying occupation of helping Poland regain its liberty as an independent nation. Having succeeded his people made him president. This position he filled to advantage until Poland's government was re-established on a firm basis. Then he went back to his piano.
