Scholarships announced by Rev. Joseph E. Grady, principal of the school, included Villa Nova College, Frank J. Estrada with Bernard Hennessy as alternate; St. Bonaventure, John E. Adams with Robert Kress as alternate; Rochester Business Institute, Joseph O. Werthman, with Francis J. Dooha as alternate.

Archbishop Thomas F. Hickey gave the class an excellent talk. He emphasized the religious ideals and principles of St. Thomas Aquinas, after whom the school is named, and urged the graduates to be true to these, and hence true to their Church and their God.

Bishop Lays Cornerstone of New School

The cornerstone of the fine new school of St. Margaret Mary, on lower Rogers Parkway, was laid on Tuesday evening by the Rt. Rev. John Francis O'Hern, D. D., Bishop of Rochester. Bishop O'Hern was assisted by the Rt. Rev. Emmet M. Walsh, D. D., Bishop of Charleston, S. C.

The new buildings cost upwards of \$30,000. The chapel dedicated on August 5, 1921, the beautiful new chapel was dedicated. The ceremony was an impressive and beautiful one, with Bishop McQuaid officiating. The Most Rev. John Walsh, Archbishop of Toronto, preached the sermon of the day. The windows of the chapel are considered the best specimens of the Munich School of Art ever imported to America up to that time.

The Sacred Heart Academy is considered one of the best schools of its kind in the country for girls, and its success has been marked all through the 76 years of its life. Its friends and alumnae join with the Sisters of the Sacred Heart in rejoicing over the diamond jubilee, and they will surely do everything possible to help make the erection of the proposed gymnasium a possibility.

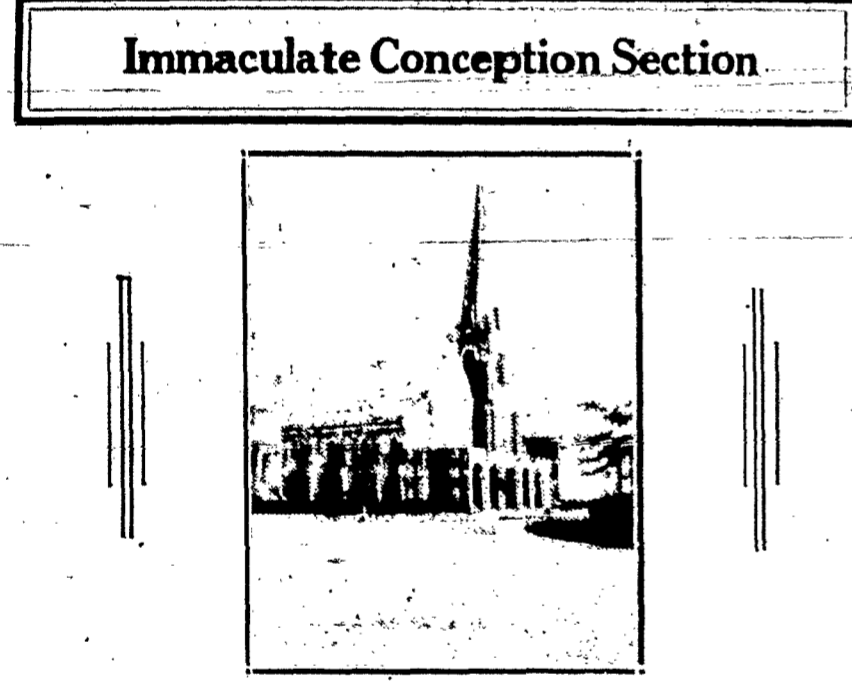
Camp on Lake Open For Girls For Summer

Workers who have been enlarging the facilities at Camp Madonna on Canandaigua Lake completed their work this week and registration is being received daily at the Catholic Women's Club building that the new facilities will be put to good use. The camp opens Saturday this week, June 28th, and a few vacancies remain for the first two weeks.

Contracts have just been returned on a \$200,000 new motherhouse of the Sisters of Mercy, said St. Stanislaus Church, with the construction of a \$150,000 school in a few days. A new hospital to be conducted by the Sisters of St. Francis in Auburn will be undertaken soon at a cost of \$350,000 to \$400,000. A nurses' home at Elmira is being built at a cost of \$300,000 and another medical building is to be begun within a month.

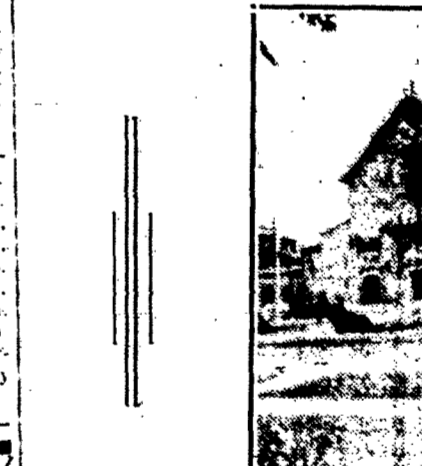
