

Ground Broken July 4th For the New Mother House Of The Sisters of Mercy

Ground was broken on the morning of July 4th for the spacious new Motherhouse of the Sisters of Mercy to be erected adjoining Our Lady of Mercy on Blossom Road.

The exercises were to start at 11 o'clock, with the Rt. Rev. John Francis O'Hern, D.D., Bishop of Rochester, officiating, assisted by several priests. The public is cordially invited to attend.

The new Motherhouse will be four stories in height, and will cost approximately \$200,000. J. Foster Warner is the architect, and he has designed a building that will be dignified, practical and well suited to the needs of the Sisters of Mercy.

Work on the building will be started at once, and it is expected to have it completed by Winter. The Sisters of Mercy have needed this Motherhouse badly for a number of years, and it will be a great blessing for them when completed.

The Sisters, in addition to teaching in a number of parish schools in the Diocese, are in charge of the splendid new Lady of Mercy High School for girls on Blossom road. They always welcome the interest and friendship of the people of the city and Diocese in their work and in their undertakings, and the construction of their new Motherhouse should be a great help in this regard.


