Priest Says His First Mass In Home Church

Rev. Clark B. Hanna, Home After Six Years in North American College Rome, Greeted by Many Friends.

The Rev. Clark B. Hanna, recently ordained in the North American College in Rome, Italy, celebrated his first high Mass in his home church, St. Augustine's, at 11 o'clock last Sunday. The church was filled to the doors with relatives and friends, and Father Hanna was honored by the presence of the Rt. Rev. John Francis O'Hern, D.D., Bishop of Rochester, who gave an appropriate and inspiring talk.

Pope Receives The Three Sons Of Boston Mayor

Vatican City, July 18.—Three sons of Mayor Curley of Boston were received by Pope Plus XI on Thursday. Msgr. Spellman of Whitman, Mass., introduced them. The Curley boys had lunch Monday with Msgr. Ryan of the Catholic University of Washington, D. C. With them when they were received were Rev. Michael Owens of Quincy, Mass., and Rev. Edward J. Fitzgerald of Worcester, Mass.

The mother of the boys died in Boston several weeks ago.

Bishop O'Hern's Congratulations

Bishop O'Hern expressed the sincerest congratulations of himself and the confreres of Father Hanna to the young priest. He told of the long course of six years taken by Father Hanna in the North American College in Rome, and of the joy his ordination brought to all his people and all his friends and he asked God's blessing upon the priest, his people and the church.

At the conclusion of the services a luncheon was held at the Powers Hotel for members of the family, clergy, and a few intimate friends. Bishop O'Hern was toastmaster. He spoke of the privilege of the priestly service, of his own pleasures in study at Rome, welcoming Father Hanna to the work of the Rochester Diocese in which his distinguished uncle, Archbishop Edward J. Hanna of San Francisco, labored as a young priest.

After the luncheon a reception was held at the home of Father Hanna's parents, 59 Wellington Avenue.

Abroad for Six Years

Father Hanna left Rochester six years ago to study at Rome, and was ordained to the priesthood in February by his uncle, Archbishop Hanna. While he was abroad, he had opportunity to witness the ceremonies at the signing of the concordat, ending fifty-nine years of enmity between the Roman Catholic Church and the Italian government. He saw Pope Plus prelate at the consecration of St. Theresa and St. Sophia, Beirut, and also witnessed the beatification of the six Jesuit martyrs who were recently canonized as saints.

Before returning home, he went to Oberammergau to see the Passion Play, and traveled through France, England and Ireland, from where he sailed.

He is the first priest from the Rochester Diocese to be graduated from the North American College in Rome in 29 years. Bishop O'Hern himself was a student in that college, and was ordained there.

To Cathedral Temporarily

Father Hanna has been granted a two weeks' vacation by Bishop O'Hern. He will then go to St. Patrick's Cathedral, to which he has been temporarily assigned by the Bishop. It is expected he will remain at the Cathedral until the return of the rector, the Rev. Charles F. Shay, who is abroad for several weeks.

Drowned Priest Held a Crucifix Tightly in Teeth

Brownsville, Texas, July 18.—The body of Rev. Jean B. Frigon, O.M.I., aged 59, pastor of Sacred Heart Church, for many years one of the most prominent Catholic figures in South Texas, was found last Thursday afternoon on the Point Isabel beach, where it had evidently floated after he had drowned. A crucifix was clonched tightly between his teeth.

The body, clothed in a bathing suit, was found on the beach about a mile north of the Gulf Side Casino Hotel, where he went on the preceding Tuesday for a few days' recuperation.

Missed on Thursday at noon when he was called at the hotel for luncheon, the alarm was given, and after about one-half-hour search the body was discovered.

Jesuit Priest With Expedition Led By American

Peking, China, July 18.—Rev. Peter Teilhard de Chardin, S.J., in his capacity as geologist, was with the paleontological expedition of the Metropolitan Museum of New York when it left Peking, China, recently for its fifth voyage into the Gobi Desert. Heading the expedition, which includes many Chinese members, is Dr. Roy Chapman Andrews.

He was recently announced that Father Teilhard would also accompany the Transatlantic Citroen Expedition, which, according to present plans, will go as far as West China to return to Peking, before starting for Indochina. Last year the priest-scientist journeyed through Shensi in his capacity as counselor to the geological service of the Chinese Government. Father Teilhard is attached to the Jesuit Museum Laboratory at Tientsin, China.
