

### "God's Architect" Found Dead On The Road Near Nagongera, And African Catholics Are Sad

Aug. 8.—Martin Hubert Nelissen was found dead on the road near Nagongera, and priests and people of the vicariate of the Upper Nile, Sudan, wept. For his funeral missalists traveled through African jungle to pay their respects and to breathe a prayer for his soul. The native Africans spoke in hushed sorrow of "Little Nelissen," "the man who spoke no language." But who was he and how did he become so dear to all?

Martin Hubert Nelissen was an architect and practical building contractor in his native town of Heerlen in Holland until the eventful day when he heard a missionary on sick leave speak of the difficulties of building churches on the missions. "We have no lay brothers," said the priest, "and few of the Fathers have any knowledge of building, though some know carpentry and are reading books on church construction. Some have put up substantial churches of dried brick and have learned by experience and by hints from Government workers. But none have time for both building and mission work. Will no one come to help?"

Mr. Nelissen stepped forward. He had no idea of a vocation to the brotherhood, but would give himself voluntarily, and immediately put aside all prospects at home. In 1922 he arrived in Africa with the missionary, Father Wilcox, and established himself at Kakamega. Here he put the priest's house into "civilized" form and designed a church and school.

The Bishop had started a technical school at Buluba, and Mr. Nelissen was called in as adviser for practical workshops. He designed, supervised, and helped the native workmen to erect the building. He then became instructor in theory and practice for the boys. In his new office as teacher he did wonders amongst his raw recruits. He taught and worked with them by day, and in the evening gave the most intelligent of them lessons in drawing. Many of these youths are now set up for themselves and others are earning good salaries working for the mission or lay people. His success among the boys was great, which was remarkable since he spoke no language, but rather a mixture of four—Dutch, English, Swahili, and Luganda. The boys loved him and looked upon him as a father. He gave excellent example in practical Catholicity, attending Mass and receiving Communion daily.

He had overdone it, he was found dead on the road. At his funeral, priests and people vied in telling of the virtues of God's architect.

### \$200,000 Given To Earthquake Victims by Pope

**Papal Legate Reports More Than Five Million Dollars Worth of Damage Done to Churches by 'Quake.**

Vatican City, Aug. 8.—A papal purse of \$200,000 has been distributed to the relief of victims of the earthquake. Msgr. Chiappetta, special papal legate to the stricken districts, reported Tuesday.

Msgr. Chiappetta informed Pope Pius XI that reconstruction of churches and parish houses could not be accomplished at a cost of less than approximately \$5,000,000. This is only a tentative estimate, and the actual cost will probably be much higher.

Belief that the earthquake which killed more than 2,000 persons last week was of volcanic origin was dispelled by the director of the Bureau of Geodynamic Observatory, who visited the zone. He said the cause of the quake was purely tectonic (of the earth), as proved by the devastating landslides.

**JELLIES AND MARMALADES**

This is the time of the year when the fruit closet looks like a famine where there are husky boys to eat the jellies and jams. Even an immense stock of all the time-honored good things have an uncanny way of disappearing, long before the fresh berries and fruits are ready. Gifts to sick friends, guests, and the constant daily demand for such home prepared sweets depleted the supply very early in the year. To restock, one will not be able to make the summer jellies, but there are any number of good things which will take their places nicely. Marmalades from the citrus fruits are always well liked. Apples may be turned into a dozen tasteful delicacies. Prunes, dates, figs, dried apricots and the canned pineapple, as well as the humble carrots, all bring their gifts to be turned into delectable preserves.

Sunk apricots overnight, add a cupful of pineapple, some sugar and cook down to make a luscious apricot marmalade. Here is one with carrot as a base, try it:

**Carrot Marmalade**—Take one dozen raw carrots grated, add four cupfuls of sugar, three lemons, seeds removed, and put through the food chopper. Add a cupful of water and cook until thick. Some will like this conserve spiced, so add one teaspoonful each of cloves, cinnamon, and allspice.

**Prune Jam**—Take two cupfuls of prunes soaked and stoned; put the pulp through the food chopper. Peel four oranges and cut the rind of two into small pieces, mix altogether with one cupful of sugar and one-half cupful of water; cook slowly until thick. Turn into sterilized glasses and cover with paraffin.

### Jesuits Honor Memory of Saint, Order's Founder

**Solemn Services Were Held in Rome on Feast of St. Ignatius of Loyola on Thursday, Last Week.**

Rome, Aug. 8.—Solemn services in commemoration of St. Ignatius of Loyola, founder of the famous missionary and teaching order known as the Society of Jesus, were held Thursday last week at the Gesù, mother church of the Jesuits, and at Sant' Ignazio, the church that bears his name.

It was the biggest celebration of their own that the members of this world-wide organization have had since the canonization of this distinguished Jesuit, the eight North American martyrs and Cardinal Robert Bellarmine, in St. Peter's a little over a month ago. The members of the order now in Rome and Vatican City, recruited from all nations, were out in force at the early Masses on Thursday, as were the young men undergoing their long novitiate.
