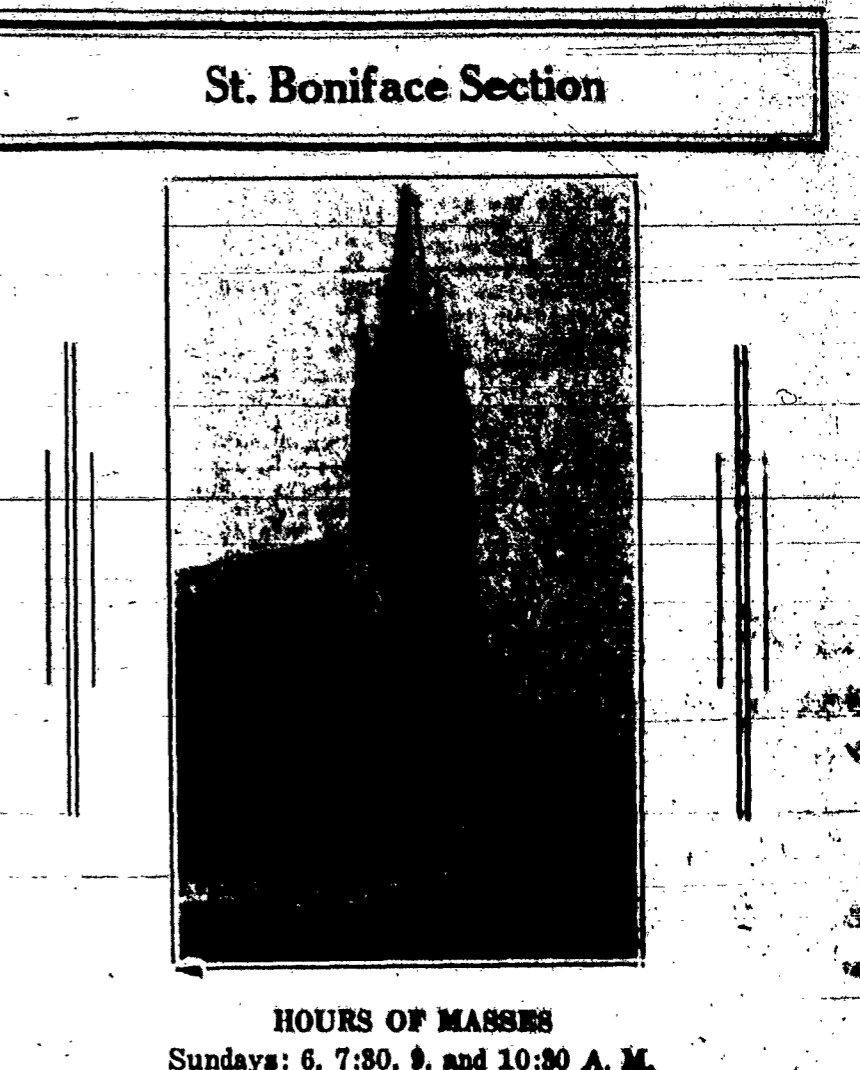
MOUNT MORRIS No Celebration Assumption Day
