Catholics in Rochester Outnumber All Churches Last Federal Census Shows

Total Church Membership in City is 178,340, of Which 92,079 Are Members of Catholic Churches—Jews Rank Next, Presbyterians Third

The United States Census Bureau has just issued a report on the church membership of the people of Rochester, the figures being based upon the last Federal Census.

The report shows that there are more Catholics in the city of Rochester than the members of all other churches combined. This condition, the report states, prevails throughout the country as a whole.

Out of a total population of 325,019, the Census shows, there are 178,340 church members, approximately 55 per cent of the total population. Of this number, 92,079 are members of the Catholic Church. Forty-five per cent of the population is not affiliated with any church, according to the Census.

Of the total number of church members in Rochester, 119,196 were under 13 years of age, and 29,190 were over 13 years. The total of church members shown in the census does not include persons who may claim to be affiliated with churches, but who do not attend services, but covers only actual members as listed by the various denominations.

The figures show that Rochester has 37 Catholic churches with memberships of 92,079. The second largest sect is the Jewish, with 16 congregations, and 22,500 members.

These figures are not complete, for there are 42 Catholic parishes in the City of Rochester at the present time.

Of the 188 Rochester churches, 140 reported that they had Sunday schools with combined memberships of 44,323. There were 3,570 officers in the Sunday schools.
