Show This Year Is Expected to Prove Greatest of All Shows—Many Unusual Features Arranged for the Week

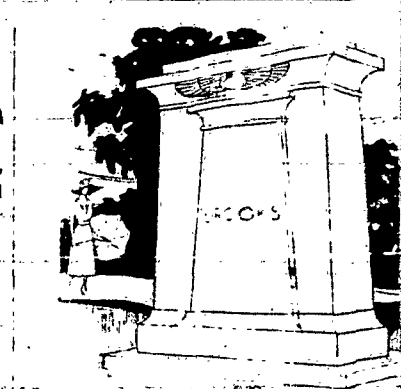
