At a mass meeting of the delegates Sunday evening the Rev. Philip H. Burkett, S.J., professor of Social Sciences in St. Joseph's College, Philadelphia, spoke on "Catholic Education." He said in part:

Incomplete Education

"The public schools may train the intellect satisfactorily; they may teach history, geography, arithmetic, spelling and the rest satisfactorily, but they do not and cannot educate the whole man, and hence they are not the schools for a Catholic child."

What Catholic Schools Teach

"The Catholic school teaches control of self and of all evil or inordinate desires. It teaches the sanctity and the sacramental character of marriage as against the trial or divorce system of our day. It teaches the love of neighbor because he is a child of God. It teaches religious tolerance where the unbending faith of revealed religion is not involved. The Catholic school inculcates appreciation of faith, prayer and the 10 commandments of God. All this is a mighty force in the education of will and character."
