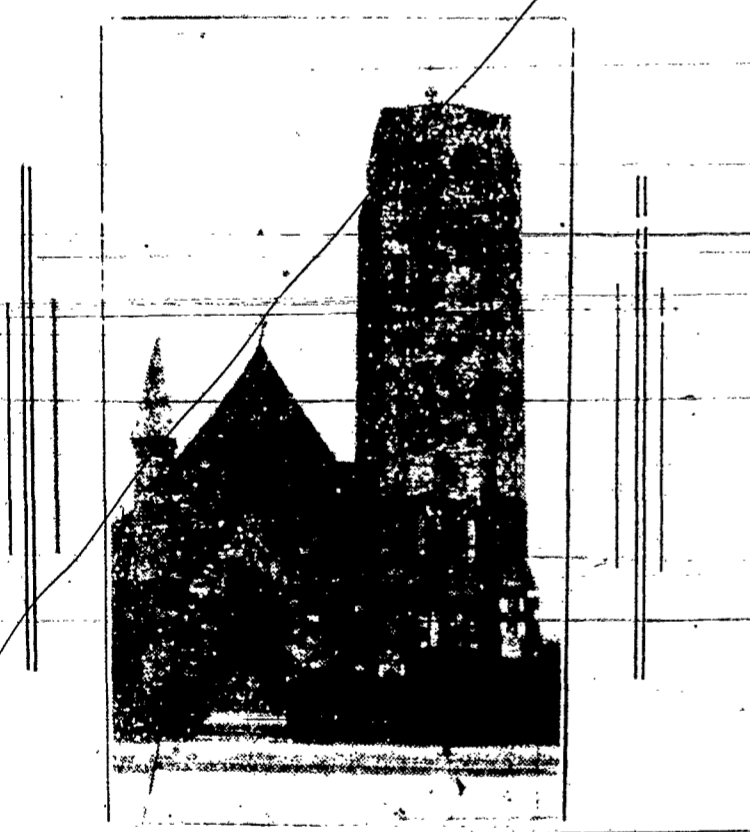

**Marvelous Altar Railing
For St. Patrick's Cathedral,
New York City, Is Being Built**

Figures of Thirteen Saints Will Be Carved Upon It, and It Will Enclose the Entire Sanctuary—Description of It.

New York, Sept. 12.—St. Patrick's Cathedral in this city will soon have what is said to be one of the most marvelous and artistic altar railings in the country. Figures of 13 Saints will be carved upon it. Kneeling angels appear in the centre of the gates, the latter being made of heavy pierced bronze. There are also symbolic designs of the Eucharist, including the chalice with grapevine and what, Alpha and Omega and symbols of the four evangelists, St. Luke, St. John, St. Mark and St. Matthew.

Gift of a Woman
The railing is the gift of a Mrs. Marion McMillan, who for many years has been a contributor to St. Patrick's. The railing is nearing completion. A pair of bronze doors at the centre will be opened and closed to permit the priests, choristers and altar boys to enter and leave in procession.

The railing will measure about fifty feet and it will enclose the entire sanctuary, serving as a continuation of the carved oak screens, recently installed, which enclose the sanctuary and the ambulatory.

White Italian marble is being used for the upper parts of a series of plain panels of Sinaca marble between posts, on which are carved the figures of thirteen saints. Each figure is two feet high and the name of each saint is in the plain white marble top rail.

The Saints Selected
Great care was exercised in the selection of the saints represented in the railing. They are: Saint Juliana of Leige, Belgium, who is best known for her work in promoting the Feast of Corpus Christi.

Saint Clara of Assisi, who was the founder of the Order of Poor Clares in 1212, this being the female branch of the Franciscan Order. At the age of 18 Saint Clara, the oldest daughter of the Count of Rossano, wealthy representative of an ancient Roman family, was inspired by Saint Francis to devote her life to religion.

Saint Paschal Babylon, who showed his devotion to the Holy Eucharist at an early age. After following the life of a shepherd from the age of 17 to 24 he was elected as a lay brother by the Franciscan Friars.

Saint Bernard, who was one of the chief saints of the Middle Ages, having preached the second crusade in 1130.

Saint Thomas Aquinas.
Saint John.
Saint Peter.
Saint Paul.
Saint Alphonsus Liguori, who was the founder of the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer. He was canonized in 1839. In 1713 Saint Alphonsus received a degree of Doctor of Laws and he had a successful Neopolitan practice until the loss of a major document. This caused him to renounce the world and devote himself with the same intensity to religion.

Saint John B. Vianney, who did an outstanding work as a parish priest of the small district of Lyons.

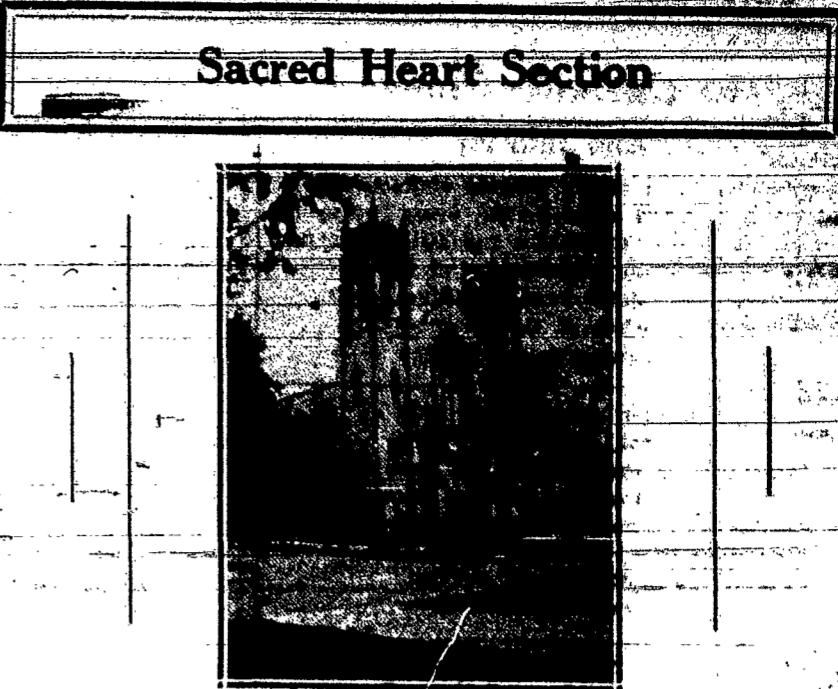
