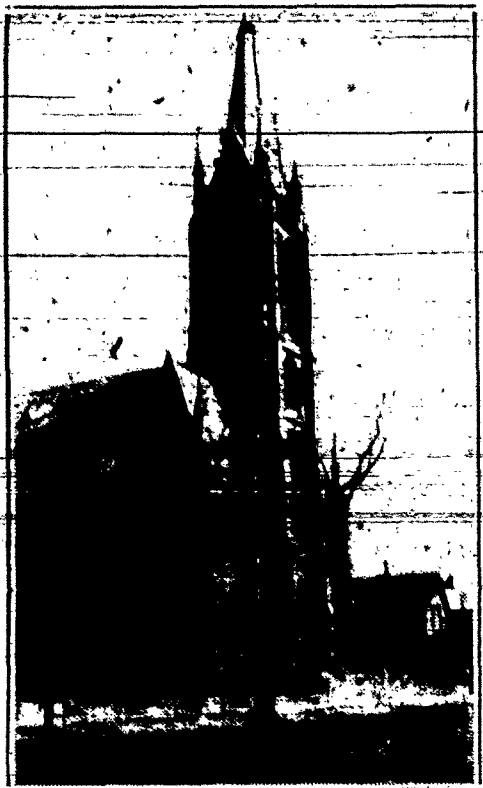

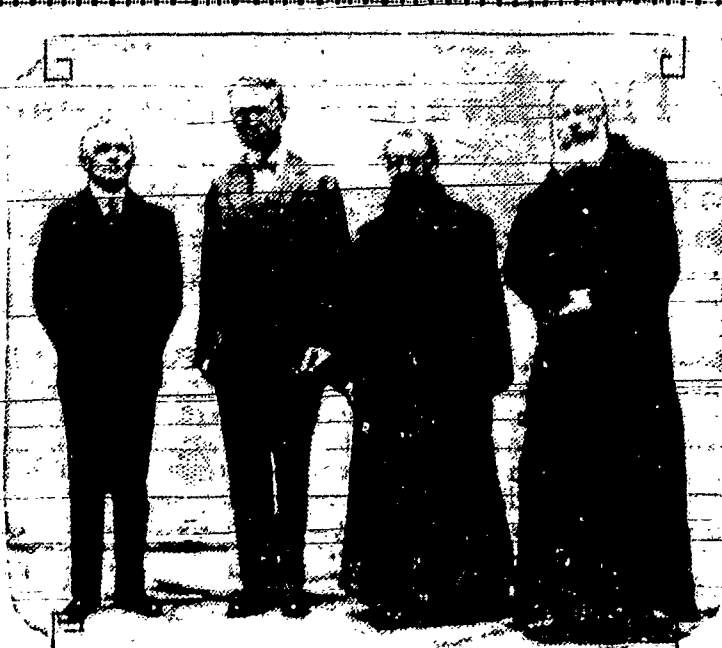

employ all their energies in making it something that is not. A normally matured adult tries rather to adapt himself to reality. The Protestant Episcopal Church is a reality quite wooden, stiff and conservative. The Roman Catholic Church is likewise a reality, always teaching dogmatically the old faith, but adapting himself slowly through the centuries to the changing needs of men. If one wants a refined, intellectual and socially irreproachable Protestantism one can find it in the Protestant Episcopal Church. If one wants a developed and practical Catholicism, one can find it anywhere in the world in that vast ecclesiastical organization whose center is at Rome in the See of Peter.

No Right to Eliminate Papacy Dr. Delany declares himself convinced that "we have no more right to eliminate the Papacy from the constitution of the Catholic Church than Protestants have had to discard the episcopate." He does not doubt the validity of Anglican orders and the sacraments, but he states that it is certainly out of sympathy with liberal Protestantism, while fundamental Protestantism appeals to him even less.

Church Dedicates Large Statue To St. Rose of Lima

Mexicans Install It in Church of St. Theresa, Mexico City Great Love for St. Rose in Mexico.

Mexico City, Sept. 19.—A statue of St. Rose of Lima, the production of a notable Mexican sculptor, has been solemnly installed in the Church of Saint Theresa in La Soledad Square. This statue was most venerated in Mexico during the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries, when it was carried in solemn procession from the Cathedral to the feast of the Saint, and was greatly venerated in the convent of the Third Order of Saint Theresa. The place occupied by this copy at the end of the 17th century, according to the historian Jose Maria Gonzalez, was a public dump which became the property of the Third Order of Saint Theresa in April 1700.

This benefaction of the Third Order of St. Rose of Lima took place on special ceremonies at this time. The fact that in the city of Lima, Peru, where St. Rose was born, a movement is under way to erect a splendid basilica in her honor, and a new canon was recently dedicated to her in the City of Buenos Aires. After the Virgin of Guadalupe, the saint is more venerated in America than in any other part of the world.
