## 5,000 Attend Holy Name Rally Batavia, Sunday

Catholic Men From Three Counties Take Part in Biggest Public Demonstration Ever Held in the History of Batavia.

Batavia, Sept. 26 .- Five thousand Catholic men, assembling here from Genesee, Wyoming and Orleans counties, took part in-a-Holy-Name-demonstration Sunday that was the biggest public demonstration ever neid by Catholics in the history of the city of Batavia. More than 2,000 were in the parade, which marched from Batavia to the fair grounds at 3 o'clock in the afternoon, moving four abreast. The parade got under way near St. Mary's Church, each division being


Distinguished Churchmen Visiting in Rochester
