Bishop Regrets Failure Of Auburn School Board To Permit Religious Teaching

He Favors Religious Instruction Outside of School Buildings For All Non-Catholic and Catholic Children.

Auburn, Sept. 26. The Rt. Rev. John Francis O'Hern, D.D., Bishop of Rochester, when in this city last Sunday, expressed keen regret that the Auburn School Board has not seen fit to favor a plan for the teaching of religion outside of the schools to all children.

The only thing of regret in these visits is that the Auburn School Board has not seen its way clear to permit religious instruction outside school buildings for non-Catholic and Catholic children of the city public schools.

A God-Given Right. "I feel that the school board deprives children of a God-given right when the growing youth of the city is not being instructed as might be in the Ten Commandments of God, for authority and law and order."

"I hope and pray that the day is not far distant when the School Board will have a change of heart and will grant this honest request to all denominations and that they will then do their share in turning out better citizens for the future."
