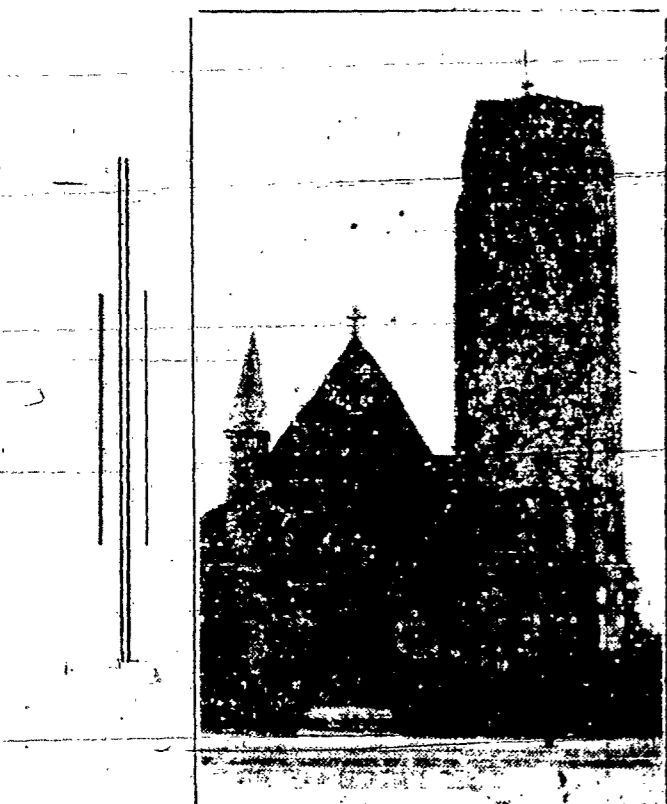

Vatican City, Oct. 17. — Among the news of the week from China is word that a number of Spanish Jesuits of the Vicariate of Anking, Anhwei Province, unable longer to bear the sufferings of their two missionary companions Father Hildalgo and Avito held prisoners by the bandits, proposed to seek to substitute the pair in their captivity. The two prisoners sent thanks for the touching offer but noted that no good would come of such an effort.

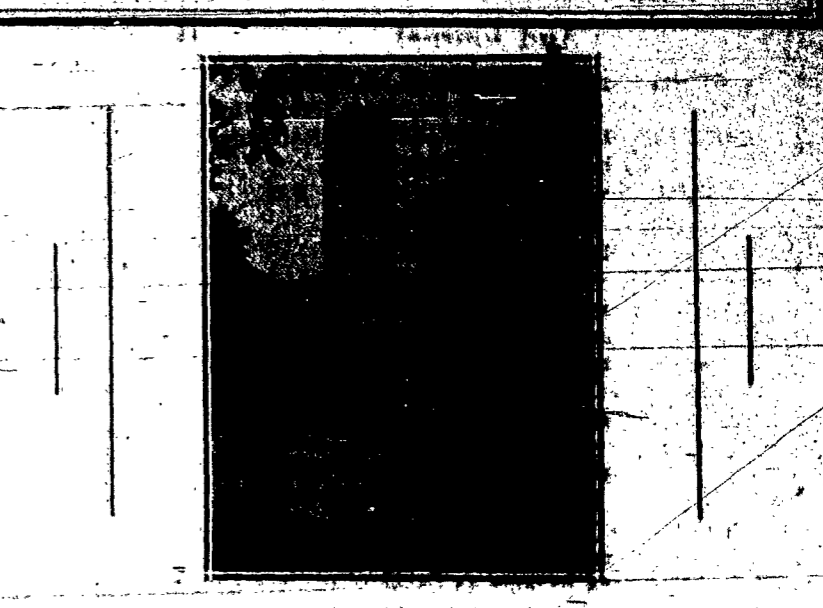
