Supper and Sale To Be Held in Northville Hall

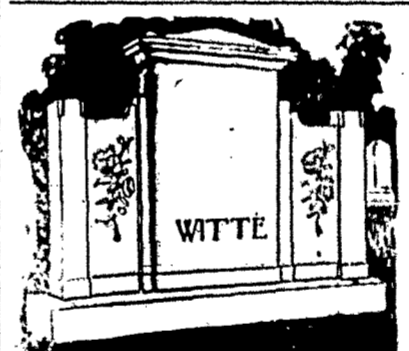
