Los Angeles, Nov. 7.—Four Bishops and the Very Reverend Provincial of the Vincentian Fathers took part in the consecration of St. Vincent's Church here a few days ago.

The church, which is the gift of Edward L. Doheny to the parish in which he has lived most of his life was begun in 1923 and was finished in 1925. The edifice cost over \$1,000,000 to build and is considered a masterpiece of Spanish architecture with a beautiful tiled dome and a slender tower rising to the height of 170 feet.
