HORNELL Pneumonia Fatal To Thomas Leahy

Hornell, Nov. 7.—Thomas P. Leahy, aged 48, one of the best known business men in Hornell, died in St. James' Mercy Hospital here on October 29th. Pneumonia was the cause of death, and he had been ill only a few days. He will be widely mourned in this city.

Mr. Leahy was born in Canton, Pa., lived there for a number of years and came to Hornell 22 years ago. He and two friends, Edward Roman and Leon F. Wheeler, now State Senator for this district, founded a dry goods store here. Mr. Leahy returned to Canton three years later, and Mr. Roman and Mr. Wheeler were partners until 1919 when the latter left from the firm. Mr. Leahy had since conducted the business, and it is one of the largest and most successful in the city.

Mr. Leahy was an active Democrat, but never sought office. He held the position of Commissioner of Public Works under Mayor Nelson and the present Mayor, D. L. McFowell.

He was one of the founders and former president of the Hornell Chamber of Commerce, one of the founders and director of the Hornell Automobile Club. He was a devoted member of St. Ann's Church and its affiliated societies, a member of the Fourth Degree, Knights of Columbus, the Alhambra, the Hornell Lodge of Elks and the Hornell Country Club.

His survivors are his widow, one son, Dr. Thomas Leahy of Buffalo, three daughters, Misses Eleanor and Mary Leahy of Rochester and Virginia of Hornell, his mother, Mrs. Thomas Leahy of Canton, two sisters, Mrs. Margaret Roman of Canton and Mrs. John Gorman of Jersey City, and five brothers, Timothy of Hornell, Daniel of Sayre, Pa., John of Madison, N. J., Edward of Canton and William of Tuscon, Ariz.

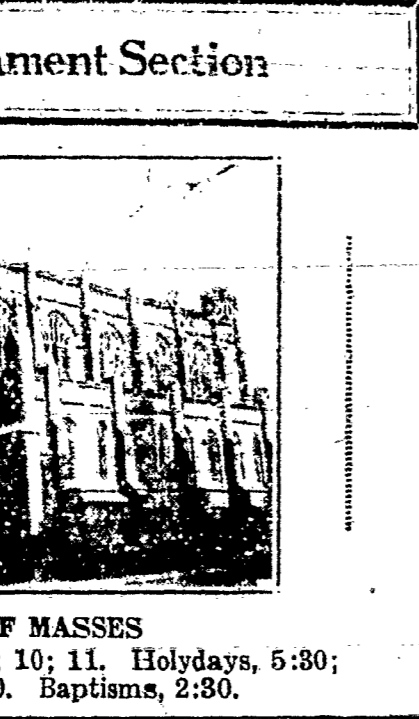
