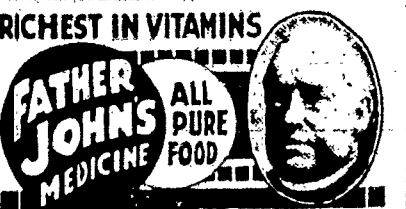

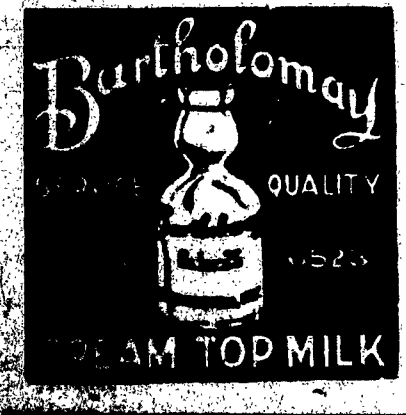

Funeral of Mother Jones, Idol of The Nation's Miners, Held in Washington Church

World-Famous Crusader for Union Labor Was Native of Cork, Ireland, and Began Her Career as Teacher in a Convent School.

Washington, D. C., Dec. 5.—"Mother" Jones, world-famous crusader for union labor, and the idol of the nation's coal miners, will fight no more for the rights of union workers. She was buried Monday, her funeral being held in St. Gabriel's Church in this city, with the Rev. Father McGuire of St. Viator's College celebrating a requiem high Mass.

President Green's Tribute William Green, president of the American Federation of Labor, said the death of Mother Jones would bring sorrow to millions of working men and women.

Idolized by Workers Mary (Mother) Jones, once an idolized leader of the United Mine Workers of America, was born in Cork, Ireland, in 1837, according to the autobiography she published in 1925.

Child labor in the South enlisted her first efforts as a crusader. As a young woman, she had worked in the cotton mills, an experience of which she later said: "I wondered that armies did not stand forth to free those slaves."
