Every Christmas the Swiss government issues special Christmas stamps which not only serve to frank letters but provide as well a fund for child welfare. Each stamp sells for a penny or two above its face value, and as the stamps most widely used are chosen for the Christmas issue the extra pennies mount up. More than seven million were sold last Christmas, yielding a welfare fund of some 40,000 francs.

The postmen are given one-tenth of the amount for their charity organizations, while the remainder goes toward combating tuberculosis and providing children's holiday centres and clinics.

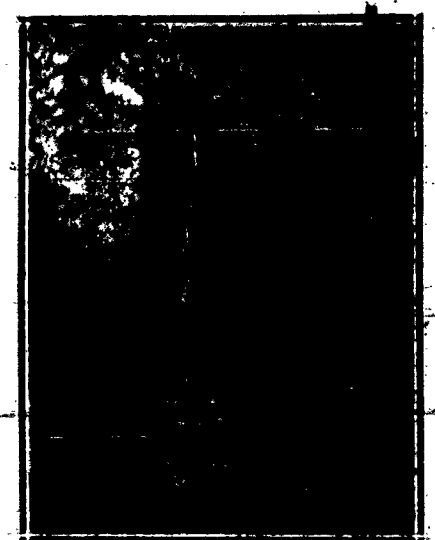
