The Rev. James J. Bloomer, Honored by Supreme Pontiff, Bishop and People, Is a Monsignor Now-St. -Patrick's Church Thronged to Capacity in Tribute to Beloved Pastor Last Sunday

BISHOP O'HERN PAYS SINCERE TRIBUTE TO MONSIGNOR BLOOMER AND HIS WORK

Elmira, Jan. 16.—The Rev. James J. Bloomer, rector of St Patrick's Church in this city for more than 60 years, beloved by all people of Elmira, 63 years a priest of God, devoted and sincere in his work, was raised to the dignity of a Domestic Prelate of the Church, with the title of Monsignor, in a beautiful and impressive service in St. Patrick's Church last Sunday morning. Three thousand people-friends, parishioners and visitors . filled the church to its extreme capacity, and gave their hearts in love to this true priest of God on this glad and happy occasion. The Rt. Rev. John Francis O'Hern, D.D., Bishop of Rochester, officiated at the investiture of Monsignor Bloomer, and paid an eloquent tribute to his life, his character and his work. It was an event that will not soon be forgotten in the city of Elmira.






