"Paddy" Griffin's Colorful Career Ended By Death

Hoboken, Jan. 23. Paddy Griffin's colorful career came to an end when he was buried Saturday in Holy Name Cemetery, Hoboken. An orphan at 13, a chore boy in a saloon at 14, he lived to become Mayor of Hoboken, to amass a fortune of \$2,000,000, and to win the friendship of men like Alfred E. Smith, John J. Raskob and William H. Todd, the shipbuilder.

Mr. Griffin was Mayor of Hoboken all through the World War, and he greeted officially hundreds of thousands of returned American soldiers when the troop ships docked at Hoboken. Once, during the war, at the close of a patriotic banquet, a wealthy young man announced that he would give \$3,000 to the Third Liberty Loan campaign if any of the guests at the banquet would climb a 75-foot fire ladder. "Paddy" Griffin, in evening clothes, went to the top, pulled an American flag from beneath his coat and waved it before 12,000 delighted people.

Work Completed On The Church At Rexville

New Roof Put On, Spire Rebuilt, Chimney Built, New Cross Erected and Whole Interior Decorated.

Rexville, Jan. 23. The rather extensive improvements that have been going on during the last two months or so in St. Mary's Church, Rexville, have reached completion. A new roof was put on, a new chimney built, the spire practically rebuilt and painted, and a new cross installed. Much of the plaster in the auditorium had to be replaced, and the whole interior has been re-decorated. As a result, this ancient edifice compares very favorably with any in the more remote districts of the diocese.

Rev. Charles F. Shay will inaugurate a new series of instructions on "Three Steps to Perfection" when the St. Patrick's Cathedral Hour is heard over WHAM at 1 o'clock Sunday afternoon, January 25th.

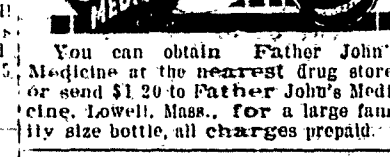

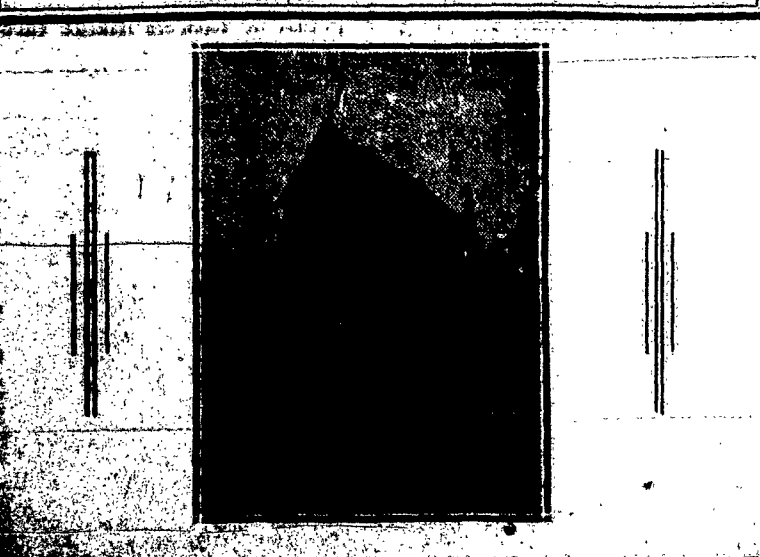

Cookies—Old Friend

By BETTY BARCLAY Cookies, those favorites of childhood, are regarded as old friends, tried and true, by adults. Here are two recipes for these cold weather delicacies that you will wish to try:

Crisp Molasses Cookies 2 1/2 cups special cake flour, sifted 2 teaspoons baking powder 1 teaspoon salt 2 teaspoons ginger 1 cup molasses 1/2 cup butter or other shortening 2 teaspoons nutmeg 2 eggs, well beaten 1 lemon grated rind 1 lemon 1 tablespoon cream Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder, salt, and ginger, and sift again. Heat molasses, remove from fire, add shortening and soda. Add flour gradually. Chill Roll over thin on slightly flour board. Cut with floured cookie cutter and dredge with sugar. Bake in hot oven (425 degrees F) about 7 minutes. Makes 2 1/2 dozen cookies.

Sugar Cookies 2 1/2 cups special cake flour, sifted 2 teaspoons baking powder 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg 1/2 cup butter or other shortening 1 cup sugar 2 eggs, well beaten 1 lemon grated rind 1 lemon 1 tablespoon cream Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and nutmeg, and sift together with sugar. Add butter, egg, lemon rind, and cream, and beat well. Add flour, a small amount at a time. Beat until smooth. Roll into thin sheet on slightly flour board. Cut with floured cookie cutter and dredge with sugar. Bake in hot oven (425 degrees F) about 7 minutes. Makes 2 1/2 dozen cookies.

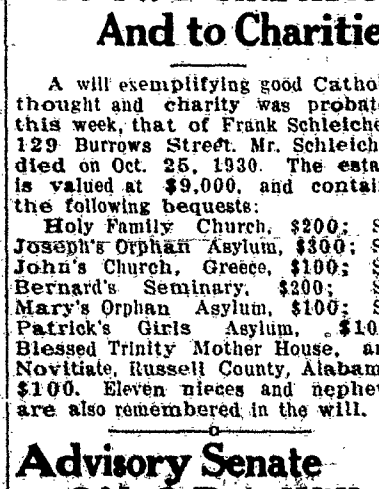
