

## Trip to Dublin, By Father Shay

Plans For Pilgrimage of Rochester Catholics to the Eucharistic Congress.

The Ett. Rev. Charles F. Shay ector of 81. Patrick's Cathedral, will sponsor a pilgrimage of Catholica from Rochester and vicinity to Dublin, Ireland, in June, 1932, to the 31st International Eucharistic Congress. On Sunday Father Shay an nounced the details of the pilgram

The pilgrimage will sail from New York on June 13, or from Boston on the 14th, and will anohor in Kingstown harbor on June 22. Because the Dublin hotels will not be uble to coare for all of the hundreds of thousands of phyrins who will of thousands of pilgrinis who will flook to the city for the Congress, the Rocksester pilgrims will live on board their ship, which will remain at anchor in the harbor until Jame 26th. Excakfast will be served on the slip every morning, and luncheon and dinner tickets provided. Transportation to and from the Con gross will be provided. Extension trips will be arranged for all who wish to remain in Ireland, or make stops in Europe. The ship will reach New York on the return trip on July 5th.

Pligrimages from all parts of the worldare being arranged to the Congress, and it is expected that half a million or more pligrims will visit Dublin during the time of the Congress. Father Shay is arranging for the Roch ester pilgrimage with the approval of Bishop O'Hern, and he has received many requests for information: All such requests should be made by letter, as telephone in-quiries are unsatisfactory, and it is difficult for Father Shay to give personal interviews to all inquirers. It is expected that several hundred persons will make the trip with Father Stray's pligrimage.
