Bishop Cannon Up on Charges Heard in Secret

Methodist Political-Prelate Faces Twelve Ministers of His Church to Answer Accusations of Four Ministers.

Washington, D. C., Feb. 6.—Bishop James Cannon, Jr., of the Methodist Episcopal Church South—the political prelate who went up and down through the Southern States in peddling bigotry against Alfred E. Smith—hobbled on crutches to the Mount Vernon Methodist Church on Tuesday, to face 12 ministers of his own church and answer charges made against him by four other ministers of his church.

Bishop W. N. Alsworth of Georgia is in charge of the hearing, and he told newspapermen the hearing would last several days.

None of the bishops will have a vote when the time to decide whether Bishop Cannon must face trial before the general conference is reached.

Extension of an invitation to Governor Ritchie is in recognition of his record as a statesman and his support of the Catholic Church.

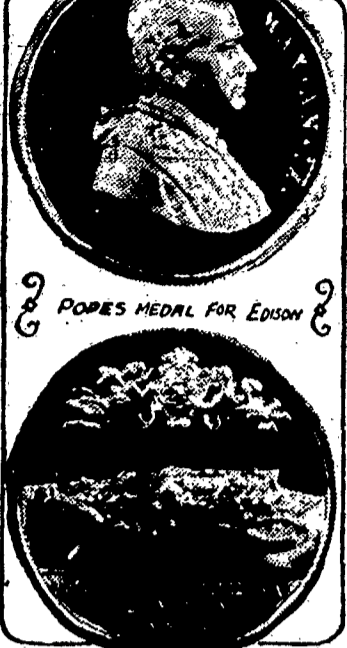
Marconi Gives New Radio Phone To Pope Pius XI
