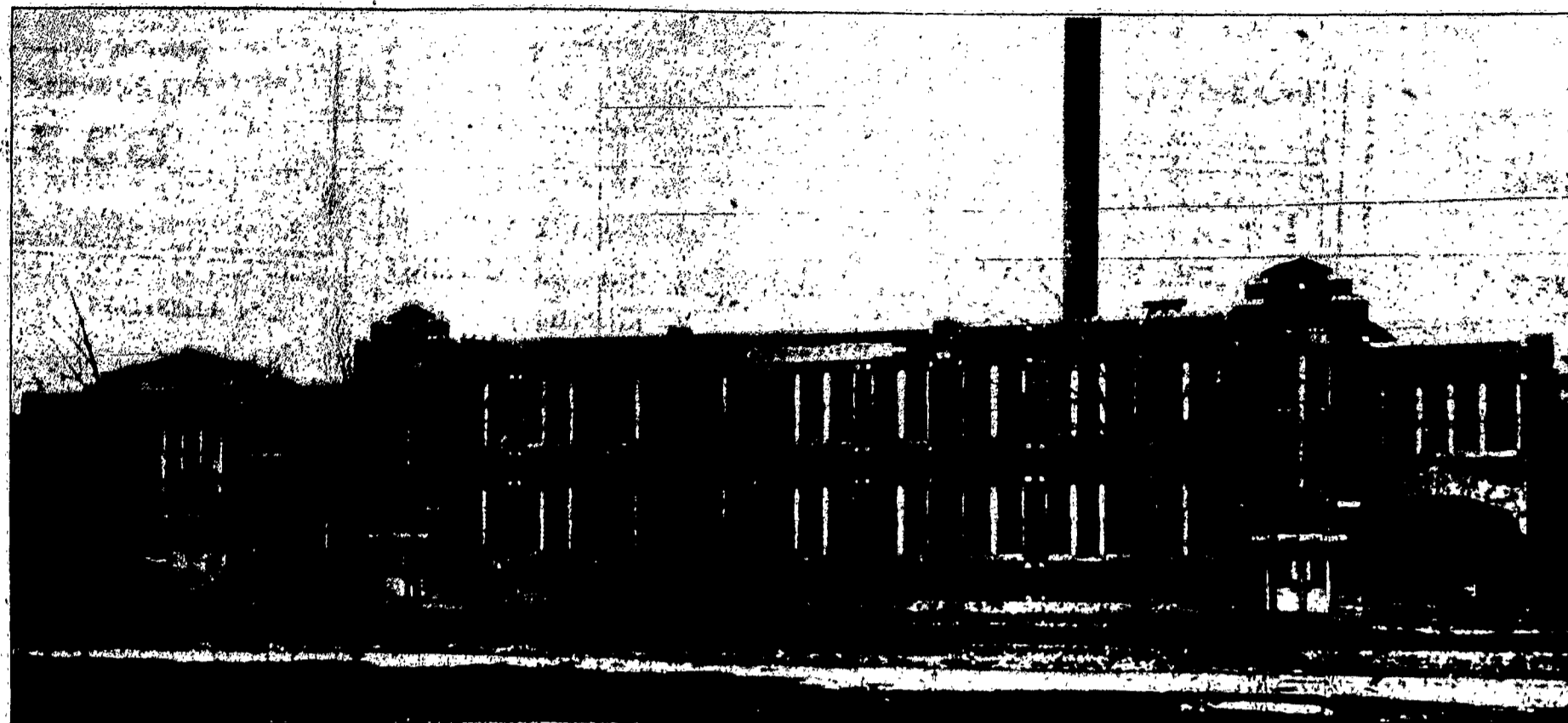


ST. STANISLAUS

Beautiful New School Will Be Dedicated on Sunday Afternoon

St. Stanislaus, patron Saint of Poland, was born at Cracow, July 24, 1550, and died a martyr to his faith on May 8, 1573. He is greatly beloved by the Polish people, and his virtues and memory are treasured by them with unfeeling fidelity. Stanislaus was ordained to the priesthood when a young man. He inherited a large estate from his parents, but distributed it all to the poor. Lambert, Zula, Bishop of Cracow, ordained him to the priesthood and appointed him pastor of Cracow. He was later made his bishop and preacher at the Cathedral of Cracow, 1573. After the death of Lambert, so greatly were his talents and labors appreciated, Pope Alexander II appointed him Bishop of Cracow. He accepted the office with the explicit command of the Pope. Stanislaus II was king of Poland at the time. He was a warlike ruler, and the masses of his subjects were greatly harassed by the cost of his wars, and were hostile to his methods. Bishop Stanislaus took an energetic stand in favor of the people, and incurred the enmity of the king. Serious troubles followed which separated the king and Bishop. Stanislaus was excommunicated by the king, and the king declared the bishop guilty of high treason. Stanislaus was arrested and imprisoned. Stanislaus refused to carry out the king's orders, and he was taken to the Chapel of St. Michael, in the suburb of Cracow, where he found the Bishop celebrating Mass. Turning to the altar, Stanislaus knelt, and looked

his body to pieces with his sword. A reputation of his people followed this deadly crime, and Boleslaw was compelled to flee to Hungary. The body of St. Stanislaus was buried in the chapel, but in the year 1018 it was transferred to the Cathedral by Bishop Lambert III. He was canonized in 1253 by Pope Innocent IV's Assisi, and during all the intervening years has been held in great affection by the Polish people. St. Stanislaus Church and school in Rochester are named in honor of this great Saint of God, and each year his birthday is fittingly celebrated by the Polish people of the city and Diocese as well as of all the world.

...the hardware for the building. These things did splendid work creditable to themselves, and most satisfactory to Father Szupa, architect. Their completion produced a school that is a credit to none in the city of Rochester. The building is a two-story brick structure, connected with the old building by means of a cloister. It has additional classrooms, a large auditorium with seating capacity for five hundred persons and administrative offices. In utilizing the old building, it will be possible to care for 1,200 children, Rev. S. J. Szupa, said. Ground for the school was broken on July 7, 1930. Father Szupa has been in charge of the parish since 1921 and with the assistance of fourteen members of the St. Joseph's Brotherhood and a number of lay teachers has been able to carry through the educational program among the Polish Catholics of the northeastern section.

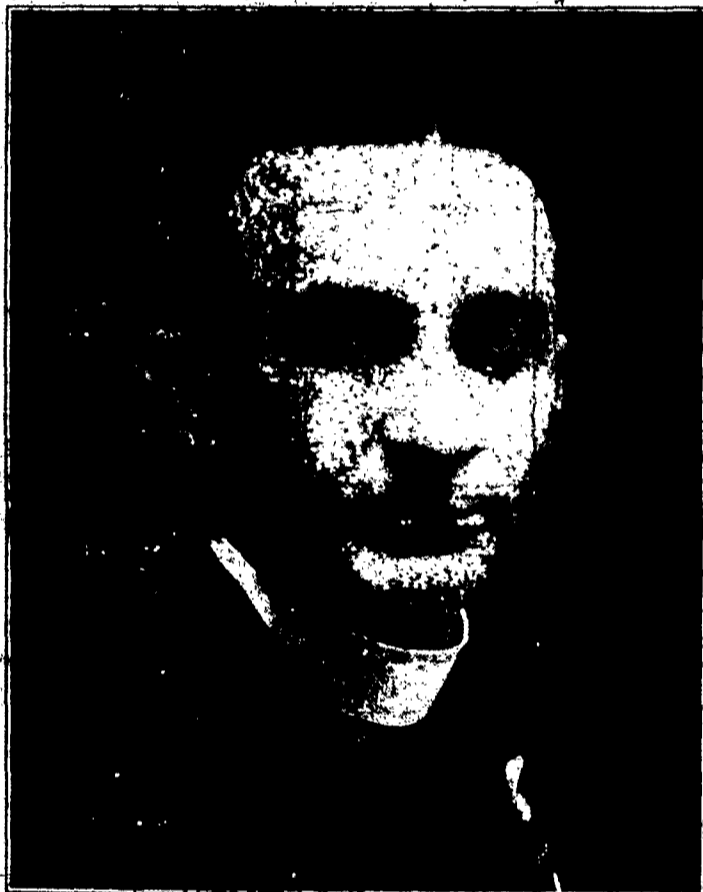

The Pastor of St. Stanislaus' Church



The beautiful new St. Stanislaus Parochial School, just completed at a cost of \$180,000, will be dedicated Sunday afternoon, at 3:30 o'clock, by the Rt. Rev. John Francis O'Hern, D.D., Bishop of Rochester. The school is a splendid new structure, a credit to the Diocese of Rochester, and a great credit to the Polish people and their pastor, the Rt. Stanislaus Szupa, and his assistant, the Rev. Peter Jankowski. The building has every modern convenience, beautifully lighted, spacious, safe and sanitary. It was designed by George F. Lorenz, architect, of 311 Alexander Street, and the following well-known firms had a good part in its construction and completion: P. G.
